❖ PRINCIPAL'S REPORT ❖

I am very proud to be addressing the CHS Alumni Association as the principal of Chelmsford High School and as a former CHS graduate. It has been many years of dedication to the educational profession and the commitment to the Chelmsford school system that has afforded me this wonderful opportunity to become principal.

The CHS Alumni Association is a model for other communities by virtue of its commitment to support its high school and its students with scholarships and various other recognitions, and it is with great pride and pleasure that I report to the Association on the status of Chelmsford High.

This Principal's Report is provided from one who has been a Chelmsford community member, a CHS student, and a career professional. The Chelmsford community has benefited by an outstanding educational institution. CHS is committed to developing the whole child through its programs in academics, fine arts, practical arts, and athletics. Our students have opportunities to shine in any area imaginable. As Allen Thomas, our former principal has always said, "There are many good high schools, but program for program Chelmsford High School is a great high school."

This year, we face many new challenges. We have a new schedule which is a cultural shift for our students and teachers. We have budget challenges that we have never experienced, and we have many changes in our staffing. As we all know, change can cause anxiety and stress. The uncertainty of the future



also weighs heavily on us all. It will be a challenge for me to support the faculty and staff through these difficult times, move ahead with change, and keep everyone as positive as possible.

Public school now means that our CHS families have to pay \$200 per student to ride the bus to school, \$200 for student parking, \$125 for an extracurricular activity, and for those students participating in athletics, -\$300 for their first sport season, \$250 for their second, and \$200 for their third. These fees make it very difficult for families to have their children participate in after-school activities. It is very difficult for me as a former CHS graduate who participated in student government, class activities, sports and everything that CHS had to offer, to see our families struggle to give their children the same opportunities.

In spite of all the challenges that we face, Chelmsford High still has some of the most successful academic and extracurricular programs in the country. We had a record number of students receive Advanced Placement

scores last year and our MCAS scores are very successful. When compared to other communities, our success is remarkable considering the fact that other communities spend much more per child to educate their students than Chelmsford does.

With capital improvement funds, Chelmsford High School had several major improvements made over the summer. The building and facilities look significantly better. The façade was power washed, windows were re-caulked, the damaged front walkway trees were removed, and the orange exterior accent panels were repainted in our school color, maroon. The stairways were also painted and the deteriorating stadium bleachers were replaced with handicapped access. It's an amazing transformation and has helped our spirits in these difficult times. Our next goal is to have each of our classrooms painted, but one step at a time.

From one Chelmsford High alumna to another, I ask all of you to continue to be proud of CHS. I know that for many of us it was a while ago since we attended as students, but it still seems like yesterday that we celebrated being in such a vibrant student-centered high school. Student dress may change, but students are the same, programs need to be supported, and facilities need to be continuously improved. "Education is expensive, but nothing like the cost of ignorance." Wishing all of you a successful year to come.

CHS ALUMNI ASSOCIATION HOLDS ANNUAL MEETING

The Chelmsford High Alumni Association held its annual meeting on Wednesday, Sept. 23, at the high school, with barely a dozen members present.

Topping the news at the session was the announcement that Terry McSheehy, Elisa Ouellette, and AnnMarie Roark were re-elected to three-year terms on the Board of Directors, and that recently retired CHS Principal Al Thomas was also elected to a three-year term.

Ouellette delivered her treasurer's report, stating that the operating, Hall of Fame and Reunion budgets as of Aug. 31, showed total assets at \$136,588.12, the endowment fund was at \$987,303.83, and the Chelmsford High Alumni Association Foundation was at \$39,389.37.

Executive Director George Simonian, in his brief but wide-ranging remarks, thanked Kristin Morris for her years of service as editor of *The Lion's Pride*, the association's three-time-a-year alumni magazine, as well as giving a nod to Kris Pisarik, the new editor, for volunteering to take over. He also reported that the scholarship awards night last spring was a huge success, with more than \$45,000 given out to deserving students. "I really can't believe we've done what we've done," he commented.

He said 25 graduates from the Class of 2009 signed up to be members, which he noted was a positive trend. The capital campaign, with a goal of \$5 million dollars, \$2 million to build an alumni headquarters, the salaries of the organization, \$1 million to endow the new building's maintenance, and \$1 million to endow the organization, is temporarily on a back burner until the economy improves further. But he stressed that the organization must set its "roots" in such a facility if it is to endure. "We're special," Simonian said of the alumni association that will honor its 20th group of CHS Hall of Famers next March. "We've got to preserve what we've got." 🍷

CHS ALUMNA PROFILE

ANNE O'BRYANT



As both the first female and the first CHS graduate to become principal of Chelmsford High School, Anne O'Sullivan O'Bryant refers to her years as a student, as a teacher and as a dean at CHS as "being a part of something special." She attributes her desire to continue her journey at CHS as principal to "a sense of community that seems unique to Chelmsford High School." She recalls the opportunities that Chelmsford teachers provided her when she was a student. As a teacher she worked hard to offer her students similar experiences and now looks forward to her new role as principal of a "phenomenal faculty" and to hiring innovative educators who will continue to inspire students.

A 1971 graduate of CHS, Anne served her class in the roles of both class treasurer and class representative; she also was a member of the majorette team. She graduated from the University of Massachusetts at Lowell where she received a BA in social studies and secondary education, and from Rivier College where she received a Masters in social science and a Certificate of Graduate Studies in administration, special education and counseling. Anne recalls her student-teaching experience with social studies teacher Eileen Fletcher. "I fell in love with her strength and with her leadership qualities. She was definitely a strong female role model for me," Anne remembers fondly.

When Anne began her job search in 1975, because there were few teaching jobs available, she substituted at Greater Lowell Vocational High School, Billerica High School and longterm at CHS before being hired in Chelmsford in 1976. At the same time she continued to work for and manage a travel agency. When asked why she would want to leave a job, which afforded her all sorts of exciting travel opportunities, she replied, "I saw a greater purpose in education." From 1976 to 2002 it was in pursuit of that "greater purpose" that Anne taught such courses as: social studies, geography, psychology, sociology, legal rights, and media production at the middle school and at Chelmsford High School.

During Anne's years as a student at Parker Middle School, it was Vice Principal Alberta Mooney, another strong female role model for Anne, who suggested that she work in the TV studio. Anne became a cameraperson and the only student to work for the first Public Access TV Station. Anne recalls how large and bulky the cameras were in the sixties compared to those of today. This middle school experience paved the way for Anne's future involvement in media, both in her middle school and high school teaching. In 1979 Anne, working in collaboration with Cable Access, won an award for her production, *Rainforest in the Classroom*. A few years later at the high school Anne began teaching a media course in which her students produced *Newzone*, a program with student anchors and reporters broadcasting

FINE AND PERFORMING ARTS REPORT

IN THE ARTS

I am very pleased to write this letter as the new K-12 Fine and Performing Arts Department Head in Chelmsford. Down Economy Can't Dampen Alumni's Drive To Give

As student after student walked past his table, which was covered by a maroon, Lion-emblazoned cloth, all George Simonian could do was smile – ear to ear.

Later, as the 11th Annual Chelmsford High School Alumni Association Awards wound down about the same time the last two American Idol finalists were performing their final numbers on a different stage some 3,000 miles away, the group's executive director put words to his exuberance before a barely half-filled auditorium.

"This has been a special evening," Simonian told students and parents at the Chelmsford High Performing Arts Center that evening of May 19. "It makes you feel so good that we're giving back to the kids of Chelmsford High School."

Quoting Albert Schweitzer, as he does every year, Simonian recited what has become the association's mantra since its inception in the spring of 1991. "We make a living with what we get, but we make a life by what we give," he quoted.

Even in a year when the state's and nation's economy had taken nose dives, the Alumni Association continued to do its part, giving out 97 scholarships totaling \$45,175 on this night to 76 deserving scholarship recipients. While association President Terry McSheehy ('64) acknowledged the number was down slightly from the year before,

the group's endowment fund remained strong at over \$1 million.

"It's a thrill for all of us that our alumni give back," McSheehy said. "This night is the finest example of that."

Al Thomas, in his last address to the association several weeks before he was to retire as CHS principal, urged the scholarship recipients to one day join the group to keep the legacy of giving alive.

"I wish you the very best of luck," Thomas said. "You were lucky to grow up in a nice town with a very sound school system," he said, adding that alumni should remember those who supported them – teachers, parents, groups like the association. As you grow, he said be part of something bigger. "And don't forget to have fun along the way."

As recipients and scholarship presenters met at center stage, time after time, Simonian, McSheehy and association Vice President Bob Pariseau had their share of fun, too, exchanging some light-hearted barbs and banter reminiscent of a perhaps more modest version of 'Late Night' host David Letterman and sidekick Paul Shaffer.

Students, some dressed in shirts and ties, some in sun dresses, others in flip-flops and jeans, at times showed their jitters traversing the stage. After one girl accidentally dropped her envelope in the excitement of the moment,

McSheehy quipped, "Don't drop your money, that's the most important part!" As one student's mother came up to accept a scholarship on her behalf, McSheehy first erroneously reported, "Oh here she (the student) is", only to be corrected by the mom. Without missing a beat, McSheehy quickly recovered, "accepting on her behalf is her mother, who looks like her sister."

But all joking aside, the night provided many opportunities for smiles – and not just because of the tasty refreshment table set up in the lobby for the post-ceremony reception.

"I'm very grateful they give back to the students," said Ben Koethe, a graduating senior who was awarded the John P. Emerson Jr. Memorial Scholarship. "It's interesting learning about the person" the scholarship was named for, said Koethe, who plans to study environmental science at Tufts University in the fall. Interestingly enough, that late "Jack" Emerson, a former selectman and longtime sewer commissioner in town, led the charge for a townwide sewer system to protect our municipal water supply. That project was in its final stages at this writing.

Mary-Kate Hazel, who won two scholarships, plans to major in history at the University of Massachusetts Lowell. "It's very exciting. It's nice to be recognized for all your hard work,"

news and feature stories to the classrooms. Ultimately, Anne brought her media knowledge and experience to her own community of Merrimack, N.H., where she was instrumental in promoting and establishing its first Community Access TV Studio.

Anne's commitment to teaching reached beyond the walls of the classroom to the roles as advisor to the student council and the 24 Hour Relay. In fact, it was at a student council conference for advisors that Anne first learned about a program from California, which brought students together with their community "to make a difference." That program is the 24 Hour Relay, which is in its eleventh year in Chelmsford. "It is a tremendous task to orchestrate" involving a year's worth of planning, which brings students, teachers, parents, community members, local businesses, the police and fire departments, the ambulance service and senior citizens all together for twenty-four hours to raise money for the community. As much as \$15,000 has been raised in a given year from which grants have been awarded to as many as seven recipients including the Senior Center, Live Smart, the Police Athletic Association, the Safe program and the CHSAA. "It has gone full circle; Students who were once on a team come back years later as a coach, a parent or as the owner of a company wishing to be a sponsor," Anne reflects.

Anne's new role as principal of CHS comes after working

for seven years as the dean of Hawthorne House. "Being a dean was similar to running a mini school. It provided an excellent training ground for me," Anne shares when asked about her years as dean. As Anne begins her first year as principal, one of the biggest challenges she faces is how "to maintain programs and keep the graduation requirements in tact without losing more teachers and support staff." September also brought with it a new, year long, seven-day rotating schedule replacing block scheduling. While this is an adjustment for both the students and the faculty, Anne applauds the hard work and devotion of the staff to make a smooth transition.

It is with great pride that Anne speaks of her family. She and her husband, Bill, who have been married for thirty-one years, have three children who appear to be following in their proud mother's footsteps. Bridget, a sophomore at Keene State, is concentrating on media and is coaching volleyball at Bishop Guertin; Brittany, a Keene State graduate, is a part-time kindergarten teacher in Concord, N.H. and son William is pursuing his interest in history and national parks.

Her hopes for the future: that the community will support CHS during these difficult times, that she stays healthy, finishes her career on a positive note and remains connected to the educational community.

When asked what three adjectives she would use to describe herself, Anne responds with the words "energetic, patient and committed." Certainly, her journey from CHS student to CHS principal is a testament to that description. 🍷


