

I want to thank Rob Russo for his efforts with regard to the Web site.



The book was dedicated to Ms. Joyce Bickel, adviser to both the Class of 2009 and to the yearbook. I was also honored to have two pages dedicated to recognizing my Chelmsford career.

On Tuesday night, we traveled to Boston to enjoy the senior prom at The Top of the Hub. It was a beautiful night and everyone enjoyed the wonderful view. The food was excellent and the seniors and their dates danced the night away. Some students went to the prom on a coach bus. They had a good time and the cost was much less than going by limo. I expect that more students will take a bus to future proms.

After the prom, many seniors and their dates returned to the After Prom Breakfast at the Senior Center in North Chelmsford. The CHS PTO runs the popular event which features food, more dancing and drawing for a variety of gifts. Many of the gifts are much desired electronic devices.

On Thursday, the class enjoyed a cookout on the practice football field in back of the school. They enjoyed the beautiful weather while playing volleyball, listening to music etc. At night, the Spring Sports Awards were presented in the PAC. Salutatorian Meghan Coughlan, Class President Michael Crafts, and Valedictorian Kayla Grant gave well prepared student speeches. Mr. Kevin Attar was the featured speaker. A graduate of the Class of 1979, he was successful in sharing memories and making suggestions about how to be happy and successful after graduating. I spoke about the culture of C.H.S. and what makes the school unique and successful.

The spring sports teams had an outstanding season. Coach Maura Devaney's girls lacrosse team shared the MVC crown with Andover and Coach Matt Dibble's boys volleyball team won the MVC title by going undefeated. The two tennis teams both had winning seasons and advanced in the MIAA tournaments. The softball team also had a winning season and did well in tournament play. They have two freshman pitchers and the future looks bright. The track teams had some fantastic performances. Stephanie Okpoebo won the Division I 200 meter championship. Other top females were Dekontee Chea, Adrianna Davis and Stephanie Muse. Top males were David Brown, Kevin Tang and Joe Van Gelder. The boys lacrosse team had a winning season and advanced in the tournament.

There were other notable events. We recently learned that the C.H.S. Calculus team placed third in New England and sixteenth in the nation. The Theater Guild put on another outstanding musical, The Secret Garden. Susan Davies won an "Outstanding Actress" award. The Pop Concert in the Performing Arts Center showcased all of our instrumental and choral groups.

Dean of Hawthorne House, Anne O'Bryant, will take over as principal. A 1971 graduate of C.H.S., she has already been inducted into the Alumni Association's Hall of Fame. She certainly will be able to provide the leadership necessary in the challenging years that lie ahead. ■



“WHAT IS IT ABOUT YOU LIONS?”

The question, posed to Norman E. “Chip” Drapeau Jr. ('78) in one of dozens of e-mails he received when news broke that he was among the nine people being inducted into the Chelmsford High School Hall of Fame, was answered simply but repeated often during the course of the CHS Alumni Association's 19th annual ceremony.

Pride, teamwork, dedication, belief, fortunate and gratitude are all simple words. Yet, there they were in the refrains of speaker after speaker singing the praises of their alma mater at the Radisson Hotel in Nashua, N.H., where the 2009 Hall of Fame banquet was held March 14.

And why not? Those qualities obviously helped fuel the road to this year's induction, which CHS Alumni Association Executive Director George Simonian noted included outstanding individuals from “all walks of life. In his invocation, Simonian thanked the “hidden source of life whose name

is holy in every culture” for all of the gifts bestowed upon us all. He prayed that the accomplishments motivate us to “care more deeply, think more clearly, and to live our lives more fully.” This year's inductees, he said, have done just that, excelling in high school, their professions, and their communities.

CHS Principal Al Thomas said each year at this ceremony it's a “privilege to talk about CHS.” There are so many accomplishments, from theater, to academics to sports, where “our kids distinguish themselves. The CHS Hall of Fame will be well-stocked for years to come,” Thomas said.

This year's first inductee, Nathan Anderson ('76), provided CHS football fans with one of their most exciting moments ever, blocking a punt and returning it for the lone score in a 7-0 Thanksgiving Day win over rival Billerica High in 1975. The defensive standout was also a stellar basketball player and track star, setting the school record in the triple jump. He went on to star in athletics at ULowell, and later in the telecommunications industry, where his Single Source Group is thriving while many are struggling.

“All of us have different takes on high school. Mine was all about sports,” the 1976 Male Athlete of the Year said. “It’s what motivated me to get good grades. I’m fortunate” to have had consistent leadership, from his father moving his family to a community where he could be accepted and get a good education, to dedicated coaches. He’s fortunate, he said, that coach Dick Bove pushed into doing track, which paid for his college education. And he’s grateful to whoever came up with the idea for the first CHS Christmas dance in 1975, where he fell for classmate Joyce McKelvey, now his wife and the “most wonderful person I ever met.”

The night’s second honoree, Jeanmarie Buckley (’82) was also an outstanding athlete and a co-Female Athlete of the Year. Her varsity volleyball team ran an unprecedented 48-0 streak during her tenure, she set the state record in the shot-put her senior year with a mark of 49 feet, 7 inches, and she was so good at basketball she earned a scholarship to Holy Cross, where she became a 1,000-point scorer. Buckley’s done a bit of everything professionally, from opening the Hard Rock Café locations in Boston, Washington and Orlando, Fla, and these days is a teacher in Brockton.

Buckley said high school was a simple time, with no cell phones, just good friends, good teachers, and good coaches. Any success Buckley said she enjoyed was a testament to those people around here, especially those like coaches Fran Rysz, and Joyce Skiff, whose “contagious positive attitude made us feel like winners on and off the court.” And a special thanks, she said, to Mr. Skiff

“for opening Baskin Robbins after a big win.” She also gave Simonian a special nod, saying she and her classmates and teammates didn’t need to look far “for the example of excellence and dedication.”

Perhaps the most well-known inductee this year, controversial WEEI radio talk-show host and Boston Herald columnist Gerry Callahan (79), scored the biggest laughs of the night.

“Wow,” he began. “Jim Rice and me in the same year. I don’t know which is the bigger upset. When I got the call from George Simonian, I said, ‘Uh-oh, this is about that National Geographic I stole from the library 30 years ago, isn’t it?’”

Simonian and longtime Athletic Director Jack Fletcher invited Callahan to lunch to discuss his induction. Simonian, he said, is like “the Armenian Dick Clark. He looks the same as he did 30 years ago. Jack,” he said, pausing for effect, “Jack doesn’t look the same as he did 30 years ago,” cracking up the audience at the expense of his former football defensive coordinator.

Callahan, a standout defensive back, gave a nod to football coach Tom Caito, who Callahan’s senior year led the team to an undefeated season a berth at BU’s Nickerson Field in the Super Bowl. “I forget what happened that day,” he said. “Some knucklehead got a penalty,” he said, referring to the clipping penalty called on him that erased a Paul Caito punt return for a touchdown. “I still say it was a bad call.”

“I wasn’t the biggest, or the smartest,” he said. “But I had an edge, I had great parents – Gerry and

Irene. And I know I wouldn't be here without Tracy (his wife). She's from Tewksbury, but don't hold that against her. It's not like she's from Billerica."

Sharon Welch Dean ('61), an accomplished author and an English professor at Rivier College in Nashua quoted Bob Dylan when recalling her high school experience, saying the times were "a changing." "We had one foot in the '50s and one in the '60s. She fondly remembered taking Simonian's biology class at the old high school, now the site of McCarthy Middle School. "I expect we skipped around the (chapter) on the reproductive system."

"Chelmsford was on the move" along with the rest of the country, as young people – society as a whole really – pushed the envelope. Her senior year, when "The Catcher in the Rye" was read, short skirts and doing "the Twist" were banned at high school dances. She said when she arrived at UNH, the first thing she did was climb "the greased flagpole." Simonian noted in introducing her, that her 1961 CHS yearbook stated, "pint sized, but dynamic... will find her niche on a college campus." Judging by her bio, it looks like mission accomplished.

During a short break in the introductions, as attendees were finishing up a tasty serving of chicken piccata, rice pilaf and asparagus, CHS Alumni Association President Terry McSheehy ('64) accepted the 2009 Lucy E. Simonian Golden Lion Award – given for community service and support to the school – on behalf of Leo Kahn, former president of Purity Supreme and

a leader in other local businesses. In addition to contributing to the school, Kahn was singled out for allowing students to have flexible schedules at his store.

For his part, Chip Drapeau, an outstanding high school student-athlete who excelled in football, basketball and baseball, said the honor was "very unexpected. I didn't know a lot about it" before being nominated, he said at a pre-dinner reception, where honorees and past inductees noshed on cheese and crackers, fresh fruit and sipped wine. During his acceptance speech, Drapeau noted that he heard from friends and former classmates he hadn't seen in 30 years. Most were congratulating him, but one e-mail, he said, stood out. It said nothing of his honor, or made any venture down memory lane about the "good old days" at CHS. It simply said, "Chip, you went to high school with Callahan, the sports radio guy from EEI? What is it about you Lions?"

The crowd of nearly 300, which consisted of alumni, past inductees and local dignitaries, erupted in laughter.

Drapeau, these days a Westford resident and married with three sons, said the e-mailer's inquiry got him thinking about what a "pivotal role in my development" CHS played. Drapeau has worked in the software field all his professional career after graduating from Tufts with a degree in economics. He helped steer MRO Software from a company of 100 to more than 1,000 with more than \$200 million in annual sales. Nonetheless, he said, "Some of my most exciting times

were at CHS. Nothing came close to the thrill I had in the maroon and white." He thanked some of his favorite mentors, like football Coach Caito, who "believed in everyone he met," and Bernie Battle, "my favorite teacher."

Barbara Kimball Mackey ('63) has been a busy gal these past 40 years, all of which were spent in the medical profession. Her yearbook entry "always on the go" still applies today, as the registered nurse has also volunteered for LifeFlight medical helicopter and for the Rape Crisis Center of Greater Lowell. She also designed and quilted the town of Chelmsford's 350th anniversary quilt. Mackey thanked her parents, both medical professionals, for inspiring her career. She said she knew in 7th-grade she had a knack for science and the study of life. She encouraged the crowd to always "have hearts and minds open to learn something new every day."

Ken McGillivray ('58), these days a standout golfer in Naples, Fla., was touted for his football, basketball and baseball prowess, as well as introducing the group technology concept as a longtime engineer at General Electric.

"I grew up in Chelmsford, married my high school sweetheart, moved away and lived happily ever after," he began. Seriously, he said he learned two important life lessons at CHS. First, it's "always good to tell the truth up front." One day he was a little late for Millie Hehir's French class. As he was walking past the last locker, he swiped a finger and marked a dirty cross on his forehead, quickly remembering it was Ash Wednesday. He said he was late because he was getting his ashes. At dinner that night, Hehir asked her nephew, Bryan, a classmate of McGillivray's who would later become a noted Catholic priest, if he knew that Ken was such a devout Catholic. Bryan told Millie that, "no, he goes to the Protestant Congregational church." The next day "she grabbed me by the ear," McGillivray said. The second lesson is that "when you see something, go after it." He recalled sitting in Ancient History and watching a beautiful brunette walk by. He said he noticed "right away what a great personality she had. That was 50 years ago, and I still enjoy watching her walk down the aisle," he said of his wife, Mary.

Dr. Michael Sargent, a local dentist, represented his late father, John "Jack" Sargent ('44), who died in 1983. The elder Sargent served his country in the Navy in the Pacific and also the school system for more than 30 years as a math teacher and later an administrator. He was a semi-professional baseball player, skills he put to good use coaching and umpiring in leagues as his own children grew. Michael Sargent said his dad, one known for always having a twinkle in his eye, "spent so much time in the principal's office" as a young boy "they thought he had a work study job there." As an educator, he came from a different era, where the rules were different. But he was passionate about his work, his son said. "Jack always wanted his kids to go far as they could, even if it took a cuff to the back of the head or a boot in the ass."

For longtime physical education teacher and coach Nancy Williams, it was about dedication, teamwork and an endless drive to help others. She was honored for not only her years mentoring students, but also for time spent serving on the school council, the MCAS requirements committee and a host of others, including one that revamped the health and wellness curriculum several years ago. She also volunteers two days a week at the Shaughnessey School in Lowell. "If you need something done right and on time, this is the lady you want," Simonian said, in introducing his former colleague.

Williams thanked several colleagues, including Steve

Meidell, one of the other principals she served, as well as Simonian, whom she called "Mr. CHS." In an interview before the ceremony, Williams called the honor "incredible," and "unexpected... very humbling. You read what some of these folks do, and I was just a teacher," she said, quickly adding she understands that, too, is an important job. Williams said she enjoys seeing former students after they've graduated college and gone on to do great things.

"I lived my career dream," she told the assembly. "My hope is for all the young people" she taught over the years is that "I helped a number of them achieve that." ■
