

it is unclear whether criminal charges are coming forth. To their credit, the School Department and CHS administrations acted quickly to address and acknowledge the issue, and the football team certainly seems to have successfully moved past it. But it is this writer's opinion that they could have gone further with sharing additional information with the public, not any students' identity, but certainly whatever punishment was meted out. Chelmsford is a great community with great schools, but like all such communities, we are not without our faults and issues. I believe transparency, while at times may be embarrassing, is always the best course.

Finally, by the time you read this, nominations for the next CHS Alumni Hall of Fame will have been closed and the Hall of Fame will be hard at working winnowing a list of deserving nominees to nine new inductees. While I am not at liberty to reveal who I am writing about, I am rooting for two nominees in particular this year, one of whom I collected supporting letters for who is a pillar of the community and continues to give back to CHS even after his own child had graduated in ways that will be spelled out should he be elected. The other is a more complicated case for whom I have written a personal appeal to the Hall of Fame Committee. Ladies and gentlemen of the committee, please give my letter from this past July due consideration. It would mean a great deal to me, to the nominee's family, and I believe, to our community. Good luck with all your deliberations. 🍀


Hello everyone. I hope you all had a wonderful summer.

❖ PRINCIPAL'S REPORT ❖

It's amazing to think that we're at the start of another school year. I feel like it was just moments ago that we celebrated the graduating class of 2013, and then in a flash the Class of 2017 showed up on our doorstep. That's the amazing thing about working in schools – the end of one year tends to blend with the beginning of the next. One day you're shaking hands with the graduates and providing them with some words of wisdom to take with them on their journey, and the next day you're welcoming the next group of ninth-graders into your school and providing them with some sage advice to survive the first week of school. Although the trends are similar from year to year, every new class of students comes in with its own unique personality. It's this new group of students that creates the renaissance within a school. There is nothing like the opening day of school. The energy, the nerves, the excitement, the possibilities, the chance to reinvent oneself...you can't help but feel invigorated and excited to begin anew.

Toward the end of September each year, my in-laws invite us to attend their annual tailgate at West Point. Every year about 100 of us go down to the banks of the Hudson River and soak in the pageantry that can only be found on a military school campus. My family and I arrive early, around 8:30 a.m., and reconnect with old friends and family, play football with a large group of kids, and just enjoy one another's company. Oh yeah, there's also a football game to watch, but that pales in comparison to the

reason why we came together. This year, I was fortunate enough to connect with a recent Chelmsford High graduate while down at the game. He is a 'plebe', which in West Point lingo means that he's in his first year at West Point and he's just trying to figure it out. After introducing him to my immediate and extended family, we got to chatting about a whole bunch of things. One topic we discussed was how he felt about his CHS education and if it prepared him for his time at West Point. He thought for a moment and then shared, "It really did. Although there's a lot of work, and I have a lot of classes, CHS taught me how to stay on top of my work and it's actually pretty easy." We continued our conversation over some cupcakes, and agreed to meet up again next year at the same time. As he walked away I was left filled with pride and the affirmation that CHS continues to be a special place that produces students ready for the real world.

Here are a few other noteworthy, and pridesworthy, CHS accomplishments from the end of the last school year and into the summer:

- We made some significant changes to our 9th-grade mentor program to better support our students as they transition to the high school. In addition to acclimating students to the operations of the high school, the student mentors now focus on the development of our core values (Perseverance, Respect, Integrity, Dedication, and Empathy). As such, we added multiple training sessions, and an extensive application process, and a student-run executive board. As a result we managed to find over 120 student mentors for our incoming class. This means one mentor is assigned to no more than four kids. Because of our numbers and the determination of our mentors and mentor advisors, we were also able to implement a mentoring program for new students to the district. So far, it has been phenomenal.

- We have no shortage of academics at CHS. The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education ranks schools and districts on a five-level scale system based on performance on MCAS. Level One schools are highest ranking, while Level Five are lowest ranked. At the beginning of the 2012-13 school year, we were ranked as a Level Two school. I'm proud to say that as a result of our hard work last year and our student performance, that we were able to earn a Level

One ranking. In addition our SAT scores continue to perform well above the state average in each area and have shown a double-digit increase in performance in each area over the past five years. We also continue to maintain high levels of participation in our AP program. Last year we had 217 students participate in 377 exams, with 85% of them earning passing scores of 3 or higher. In addition, we had 11 students recognized as commended students according to the National Merit Scholarship Qualification Test, and 2 students identified as National Semi-finalists in this competition. Since these awards are typically given to the top 1-3% of the testing population, CHS had 4% of its senior class receive recognition.

- Although the summer was short, there was no shortage of capital improvements to CHS. In addition to the turf field project you will read about in this issue, we installed a new gymnasium floor, a new computer graphics lab, a new mini-Mac digital photography lab, all new univents in the classrooms, new lighting and motion sensors in the hallways, gymnasiums, and offices, all new toilets and other water saving plumbing equipment, a new VOIP phone system, new technology switches in each of the server rooms, 11 ceiling mounted projectors and 6 more interactive white boards, and painted all of the interior, hallway doors, and stair railings. We tried to get the fourth-floor pool that we all used to hear about, but there wasn't enough time. Perhaps next summer? 🍷

Well, we have been back to school for just a couple of weeks, but the Fine and Performing Arts Faculty and Students are in full swing after a busy summer!

Before I begin to outline all of the exciting department news, DID YOU KNOW that the Fine and Performing Arts Department has its own TV show? The show, Spotlight on Fine Arts, is aired daily at 9:30 a.m., 12:30 p.m., 3:30 p.m., and 6:30 p.m. on the TeleMedia educational channel (CTM ED) on Comcast 22 and Verizon 36. Episodes can also be viewed on the school website and online at <http://www.chelmsfordtv.org>. I invite you to watch the department TV show through the year to keep abreast of Fine Arts news!

Now, back to the updates...For two weeks in August, a dozen Chelmsford middle and high school flute players have been spending time together as a section and honing their skills on their instruments. The third annual Chelmsford Summer Flute Camp was held at the Chelmsford Center for the Arts from August 12-22, and gave students a unique opportunity to play music in a setting designed just for flute ensemble, or as they call it, "flute choir."

Ranging in grades from 5-12, the students were given a pile of brand new music, scale sheets, and sight-reading exercises. They diligently worked together in two levels (one beginner ensemble, and one intermediate/advanced ensemble) to rehearse music as a small chamber ensemble. During the school year, the students rarely have a chance to work in homogenous instrument groups, as the school bands rehearse during the day as a full ensemble. This gave them the chance to fine tune skills specific to the instrument and help them to develop their technique.

Director and flutist Allison Lacasse, who founded the camp, says that this is one of her favorite two weeks of the year. Allison is passionate about giving the students a chance to bond together as a section and to spend some time with the students in a strictly flute-playing setting. She stated that the students truly come together and bond as a group, and musicians from across schools and grade levels collaborate, which they wouldn't be able to do otherwise. "Musicians, especially young musicians, must create a sense of partnership and respect for each other. That's how band should always be—students enjoying playing with and for each other."

The students put on a culmination concert for their families at the end of the camp. Both ensembles performed their own flute choir pieces and ended with a grand finale of "Flute Camp Canon," their own version of Pachelbel's "Canon in D Major."

The Chelmsford Summer Flute Camp is open to anyone in Chelmsford or in surrounding towns who have played the flute for at least one school year. Next year's camp will start on August 11 and run until August 21st.

Also this summer, the Music Department hosted our 6th Annual Band Camp, directed by CHS Director of Bands Matthew Sexauer, '96. This year, the students are excited to be performing a field show featuring the music of the opera "Carmen," by composer Georges Bizet. If you have not heard this dynamic arrangement, I would invite you to attend one of our home football games this season, where you can also admire the new turf field!

In addition, September 13th marked Chelmsford High School's third annual "Band Night." At this event, Students from CHS, Parker Middle School, and McCarthy Middle School joined the Westford Academy Band at George Simonian Alumni Stadium to perform a special halftime show featuring the music of Michael Jackson. Approximately 350 students participated in the performance for a cheering crowd of family and fans. Said CHS Director of Bands Matt Sexauer, "If you told me we'd have around 350 students on the field for this year there is no way I'd believe you! I'm thrilled with the turnout, and have already heard numerous positive comments from students and parents."

In art news, CHS students now have the opportunity to study Graphic Design in a brand new lab. The lab, settled in the heart of the art rooms, was funded as a capital project by Chelmsford. Town and school personnel worked together over the summer to create the state of the art space for students. The lab features 25 new Mac computers and a double projector screen controlled by the teacher that can project images from any computer in the room. Currently, all Computer Graphics classes are held in the lab, and the Fine Arts Department will continue to develop technology-based art classes that will allow Chelmsford students to keep abreast of industry standards in graphic design, animation, and photography.

The Chelmsford High School Theater Guild is back for a fabulous 2013-2014 year. First on our list of shows - You are all invited to attend the wedding of John Patrick Flanagan to Francesca Ficarelli on October 18th and 19th at the Central Congregational Church.

The time is 1955 and politics are reaching new heights in Massachusetts. 

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Since the fall of 1989 the Lion's Pride has continued to be a great publication and, as always, it reflects the work of the whole team: Editor-in-Chief Kris Pisarik; Nancy Williams, Class News Editor; Sandie Taylor, in charge of Special Assignments and Alumni Profiles; Student Profiles contributor Debbie Haywood; Fine and Performing Arts head Christy Whittlesey; Athletic Director Scott Moreau; Advertising Manager Mary St. Hilaire; Lynne McSheehy and the Proofreaders; Life Milestones Editor Nancy Hughes; Class Agent Liaison Jeff Gallant; Mailing Specialist Dan Looney and his company; and Paul Favreau and the Gilet brothers, formatting and printing experts without equal! It's a dynamite-looking publication!

Giving Back is a main theme of the CHSAA. Our \$1,200,000 Endowment Fund is bearing wonderful fruit as we continue to provide financial awards to deserving seniors and alumni. This year there were 102 awards given, and more designated scholarships are being created every year. On May 9th at this year's 15th annual Awards Night, over 200 people gathered in the wonderful Performing Arts Center to receive or present Awards and/or cheer on recipients. We were glad to welcome supportive members of the community (school staff, Superintendent of Schools, School Committee, Town Manager and Selectmen, as well as others who volunteer in many capacities.) We presented 125 checks in the total amount of \$44,280! We also awarded \$150 to a senior from Wilmington.



Since 1993 the CHSAA has awarded a total of \$564,280 in 1140 scholarships to CHS seniors and alumni, as well as \$3850 to 17 Wilmington seniors through the Carl Olsson Memorial Scholarship. The Scholarship Committee chaired by Joan Murphy and Carol Pilat deserve our eternal gratitude, as they lead a committee whose work of determining the recipients must be conscientious and intense. Nancy Hughes chairs the Awards Night Committee, responsible for making the Night happen efficiently and smoothly in May! Again, I want to thank Terry for once again being a masterful Master of Ceremonies! We hope people will seriously consider joining us for next year's Awards Night.

In March, nine more members were inducted into the Hall of Fame. Close to 300 people attended, and we're hoping to host a similarly successful event next year, which will be our 24th! March 22, 2014 is the date to put in your calendar. Again we thank Bruce McMaster and Howie Neild of the Hall of Fame Committee for a great night. Please join us!

Under the leadership of Jeff Gallant, the Fourth of July Booth had a very successful day! Ten new members were gained, while 4 people rejoined, and 3 members paid their dues for the year. For some, it's getting to be a tradition! Thanks to Terry for obtaining the Red Sox tickets once again that were used as the prize in the membership raffle. We sold \$74 worth of merchandise, as well. Thanks to everyone who volunteered! The booth provided an opportunity for a lot of mini-reunions, lots of visibility, and lots of fun! Congratulations to Jeff and his crew!

The lifeline of the Association is our Membership. As of the 1st of September, the Association has over 1600 active dues-paying members. Almost 500 of that number are Life Members. On the negative side, we still lose about a dozen members every quarter due to non-payment of dues. If we didn't have this loss, our membership would be well over 4000. Under the leadership of Al Thomas a membership drive will be conducted this fall, wherein all members from the 60's, 70's and 80's who have dropped out will be contacted and asked to re-join the Association. Mike Desmarais, our dues collector has been a great help!

Another special thanks goes to Bob Logan, who handles all of our tax issues.

The Alumni Authors' Corner, which was established ten years ago, continues to grow. The works of published alumni are on display and are available in the Learning Commons. There are 96 works on

display, with four more waiting to be framed. The wall mountings were constructed by Bob Pariseau and copies of the published works are kept in a display case in the area. Many thanks to Mark Maybury for all of his efforts in collecting the works and preparing them for display. You should make an effort to see the Authors' Corner.

The CHSAA web site, www.chsalumni.org, is our immediate link to the outside world, thanks to Jessica McSheehy Del Llano. It features who we are, our calendar of events, Endowment Fund, Scholarship, Hall of Fame, Membership, Reunion and Capital Campaign information.

Two years ago we added two students as non-voting members to the Board of Directors. The objectives behind this action were to increase OUR knowledge of high school activities from the students' perspective and to have the students become more aware of what an Alumni Association is all about. This initiative has been very successful.

The Capital Campaign is still on the back burner for the time being. As you know, our goal is still \$5,000,000. The first million will be invested in an endowment fund for salaries: Executive Director, Administrative Assistant, and Web-Master. At present these are all volunteer positions. The next million would be in an endowment fund for the operation of the Association. Then two million would be for the construction of a new Alumni Hall. The last million would be in an endowment fund for the operation of the building. What we need are a few alumni players who would like to make their Alumni Association a philanthropy....and then watch the Alumni Association fulfill its mission!!

At this time I would like to thank Principal Charlie Caliri and the staff at the high school, especially Cathi Emanouil, for their 100% support of the CHSAA over the past number of years, as well as the Superintendent's office for their continuous support. For one thing, they let us use this building whenever we need to – such as tonight.

In closing I would like to thank Terry McSheehy for all he does as president. Thanks also to Bob Pariseau, our past vice president, who is retiring from the Board, for his many years of service. However, he has promised to do all of the 'behind the scenes' work for our standing committees. Thanks to our treasurer Elisa Ouellette, for keeping all of our financial matters neat and clean; and to Nancy Hughes, our clerk, who never misses a Board meeting. And to Jessica Del Llano for her efforts as our recording secretary. And finally to the Board of Directors and all the committee members who have worked hard this past year to make this organization the huge success it is today.

Public high school alumni associations are a rare species. We are in our twenty-fifth year of doing good things for CHS and its Alumni. Being an old biology teacher, I would hate to see this organization become extinct.

However, as I have said in the past and will continue to say, people and organizations can be like trees. The rise to prominence is exhilarating, but anything that puts up shoots faster than it puts down roots is fragile and in danger of breaking, falling or dying. The Capital Campaign is crucial if we are to endure as a viable organization.



TURF'S UP!

CHS, community christen new artificial playing surface

This was a battle won in the trenches, grinding out the tough yardage.

The sparkling new artificial playing surface that covers the field at Simonian Alumni Stadium was an all-around team effort. And when I say team, we're talking about school and town leaders pulling together, like a guard leading a tailback on an end-around sweep that so excited the support of the community that representatives rallied around the project at last year's Town Meeting.

It had former Chelmsford High football greats like lineman Sal Lupoli -- for years now a volunteer coach of the football lions -- leading the charge on the private fundraising effort, and George Dixon, a selectman, a member of CHS 1963 undefeated, untied gridiron squad, banging the drum for donations big and small through comedy nights, motorcycle raffles and golf tournaments as chairman of the Synthetic Recreational Fields Committee.

But football analogies aside, supporters -- and there were many -- will be quick to tell you this was not just about football, not by a long shot.

"Everyone keeps talking about it as a football project, but actually games played by girls and boys soccer far outnumber the football program,"

said Al Thomas, a School Committee member, former CHS principal and a member of Dixon's committee. "There's field hockey, etc. It's important for people to understand. This is a community activity."

That's because the turf field that was christened Friday, Sept. 6 with a special ceremony before the Tewksbury game at the stadium was just part of the project. The Board of Selectmen chose the firm, Green Acres of Lakeville, from among six bidders and awarded a \$2.4 million contract, which not only included the artificial playing surface there, but also at McCarthy School, a top-notch eight-lane track and lights were also being installed this fall.

"McCarthy Field is going to be in huge demand," Thomas said, noting CHS will be able to host some of the major track, soccer or lacrosse matches that often go to other schools with better facilities.

That's all about to change.

"We'll be able to hold tournaments, jamborees. Hopefully we can put a partnership together with UMass Lowell," said Dixon. "There will be lights at McCarthy for the first time..."

The project, which was overwhelmingly approved at Town Meeting, is receiving funding from several sources. Community

Preservation Act funds from property-tax surcharges will cover \$1.2 million, and \$575,000 in the fiscal 2014 capital budget will buy the track. Private fundraising produced a little more than \$500,000 at this writing and is continuing. A town bond of \$800,000 is to be repaid through user fees, rental and possible naming rights for the fields. Town officials have estimated rentals at \$125 per hour of both fields could bring in \$143,000 annually.

Dixon, who was a center on legendary CHS football coach Joe Nolan's last team before moving on to play quarterback and swing back as an upperclassman, said the field at McCarthy was brand new when he played, so he didn't have to endure the worn-out center of the field hundreds of players in recent years played upon.

"(But) this is so much nicer and it will be utilized by so many people," Dixon said. "Lacrosse, soccer, field hockey... So many more kids play. The track is beautiful... It will be great for the community."

CHS Athletic Director Scott Moreau, also a former football Lion, is pleased, to say the least.

"It's unbelievable how everyone came together... the school, the town, even the kids" played a big role at the

various fundraisers, Moreau said. “Our kids, our community, deserve this. It was a lot of hard work by a lot of people. I think it’s great.”

CHS Alumni Association Executive Director George Simonian, whose name graces the stadium at the high school, is happy for the kids, too.

“We brought the field up into the modern age,” he said. “The artificial turf creates a situation where you don’t have to worry about wearing it out. It’s a great value. They’re two really nice fields, nice venues that the town can recoup some of the expenses. It can be leased, rented. It’s valuable in that sense. That’s the real beauty of it, they’re accessible, right off Drum Hill.”

The artificial surfaces will be much more durable and allow the other natural turf fields to be rotated, Thomas agreed.

“It’s fantastic,” Thomas said. “The problem we have in town is we can’t maintain fields. When lacrosse was playing (at the stadium) it was a dust bowl, there were holes all over the field.”

When the project was first proposed, some feared the town wouldn’t get behind it. How wrong they were.

Said Simonian, “There was a bunch of real good people working on this... Some people really pushed for it and raised a lot of money. It was a good grassroots effort.”

On the private fundraising side, one company donated a fifth of the money but doesn’t want recognition, according to Thomas, adding that, “a lot of it came from hard work from average people.”

Concluded Dixon, “This was a total team effort. I’m proud to have been part of the committee. It’s amazing how much work everybody did. It was a great effort by the town.” 🐉

The 2012/13 school year was another great athletic year for CHS. Four of our teams won league championships and 24 out of 31 teams qualified for the post season. Individually we had 10 Boston Globe/Herald All Scholastic selections, 6 individual state champions, 3 league players of the year and 3 of our coaches were recognized as coaches of the year. There were 1,478 participants and over 60 programs offered with an overall varsity record of 261-194-16.

We have had an extremely busy summer upgrading our facilities and getting ready to host hundreds of contests. We are truly grateful to everyone in the community who stepped up huge to help us secure two new turf fields and give our student athlete's state-of-the-art facilities. While this was being



accomplished we were also able to totally renovate the CHS gym. The work that has been done in the last two years has made CHS one of the top sports facilities in the area and our coaches and athletes truly appreciate what they have.

The 2013-14 season has begun and participation numbers in all of our programs is very strong. The coaches and athletes have been preparing for months and are ready for the season. Along with competing full time on the athletic fields and courts, all of our teams will be involved in community service projects organized by the captains of each program. Please look for some of their projects throughout the fall; it's always nice to see our student athletes engaged in positive endeavors outside of athletics. It's an exciting time of year for high school athletics and we look forward to seeing all of our community supporters at the events along the way. We couldn't do it without you!





In Arles there is a duplicate of a Roman coliseum, it dates back to the early ADs. It was used for sporting events and today it still operates for bullfights, but mostly is a venue for concerts. Then they are eventually butchered and become

part of a buffet lunch, prepared at the ranch for other visitors. The meat was very lean and tasted much like buffalo.

Dick hopes you have enjoyed reading of their culinary expedition so far. If you did watch for Part Two in the Winter Pride. The Riverboat will take them further south to Avignon, France.



These recent graduates were just a handful to benefit from the group’s generosity. In his opening remarks, association President Terry McSheehy noted that 102 scholarships were being given out that night, and that more than \$500,000 had been awarded since the program began.

The numbers weren’t lost on first-year CHS Principal Charles Caliri.

“I’ve said it 1,000 times before, and I’m not the type of person that says something I don’t mean. Chelmsford High School is really a special place,” said Caliri. “There are lots of little things” that make it so, he said, from student achievement in the classroom and athletic fields to rallying for good causes, such as a faculty member’s child’s cancer battle. “I can point to a million little things.

“Now for the big stuff,” said Caliri. He reported that CHS had made Newsweek Magazine’s best high schools list and that CHS was ranked ahead of Andover. “Westford’s ahead of us, but we’re not resting on our laurels.”

In conclusion, Caliri summed up what the evening was all about.

“We’re investing in you,” he told students. “This is and will be your organization.” ❖

The Chelmsford High School Alumni Association Scholarship Program

The Chelmsford High School Alumni Association Scholarship Program is part of an endowment fund that was established in 1990. At the 1990 annual meeting of the association, George Parkhurst of the class of 1932, suggested that the association establish an endowment fund as the start of a scholarship program. It was voted and George Parkhurst donated \$1000 to begin the endowment concept. A general fund raiser was conducted and the first monetary awards were given in the spring of 1991.

At the annual meeting of the alumni association in 1991, George Parkhurst proposed the concept of "special scholarships". These scholarships would be developed by donations from individuals, an organization, a business, or any other entity and would bear the name of the person or organization being recognized by the particular scholarship. Mr. Parkhurst also established the first "special scholarship" which bears his name today. These scholarships are now known as designated scholarships.

As of this issue, there are 99 of them with three more in the pipeline for next year. Any family, individual, or organization may establish a scholarship in recognition of a person, organization, or group by donating a minimum of \$5,000 to the Chelmsford High School Alumni Association scholarship endowment fund. This donation becomes the principal or base amount of the individual scholarship fund. This scholarship fund may be added to at any time which then increases the principal or base. The annual amount of the scholarship award is derived from the annual accrued interest on the scholarship principal. To support these scholarships, the endowment fund continues to grow because of the generous contributions of graduating classes, alumni, parents, and friends of Chelmsford High School. The Alumni Association Scholarship Awards are given only to Chelmsford High School seniors and alumni.






