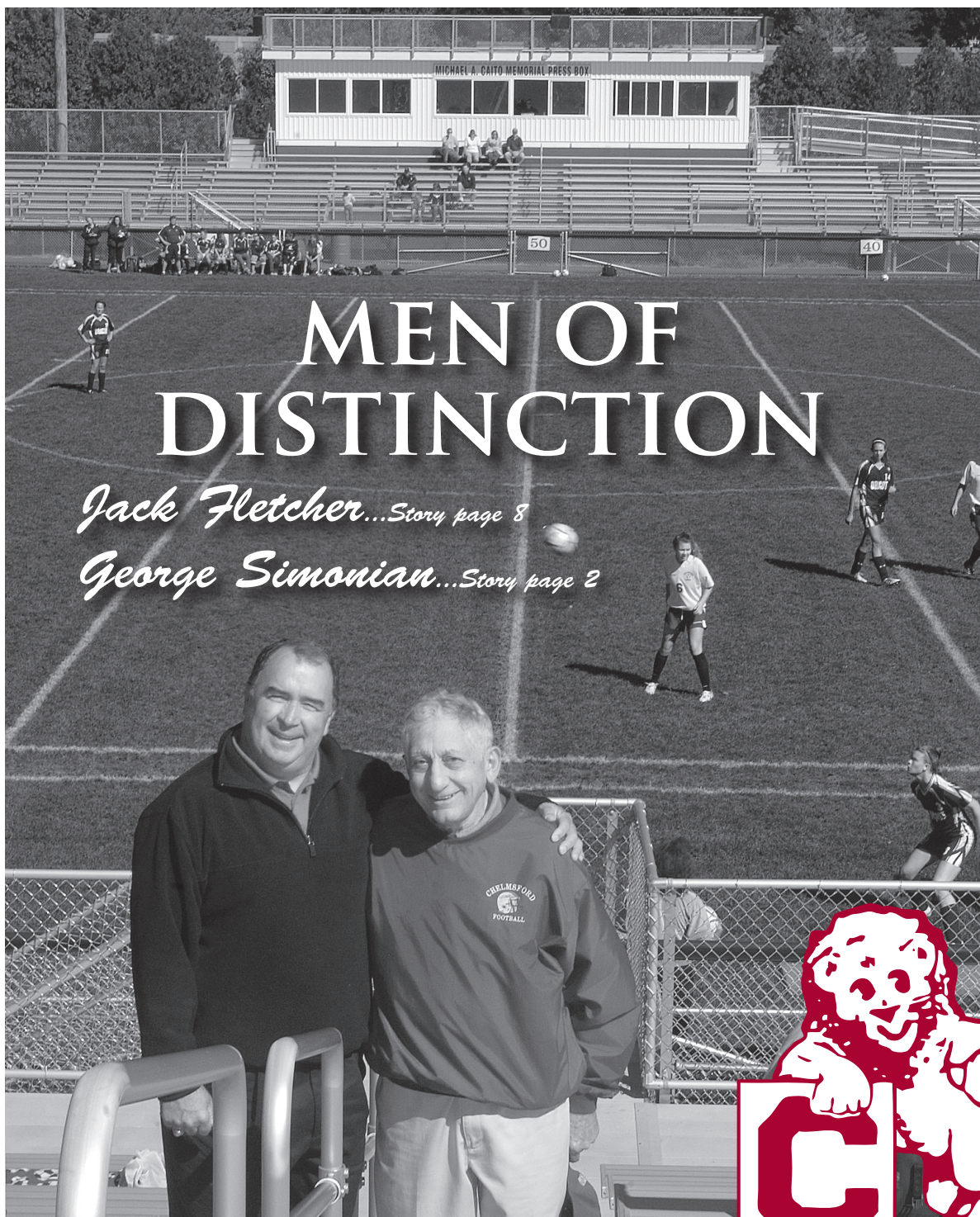

**LOWELL HIGH
DISTINGUISHED ALUM
SIMONIAN IS CHELMSFORD
HIGH'S BEST FRIEND**

When I learned in mid-September that George Simonian, our esteemed executive director and my former principal at CHS, was being inducted into the Lowell High School Distinguished Alumni Class of 2010, my first impression was: what took so long? After all, the Hall of Fame committee of this organization wisely inducted him here in 1994 for his years of dedicated service as a tireless teacher, principal and all-around dynamo. Was Lowell just catching on to what we here in Simonian's adopted hometown of Chelmsford have known for years: this is one incredible man.

But in fairness to the nomination committee in Lowell, and also to put the magnitude of Simonian's latest honor in perspective, this year's induction marks only the seventh, bringing Lowell's total honorees to just 35. Recently retired LHS Headmaster Bill Samaras, also a selection committee member, noted that the school has graduated more than 100,000 students in its almost 180 years. That's a pretty impressive ratio, by George, or by anyone else for that matter.

Simonian, a Lowell Highlands boy, graduated from LHS in 1945. He was a member of the Science Club, ran varsity track and was also an Eagle Scout. His science interest took him to Trinity College in Hartford, Conn., where he earned a BS in pre-med, then a masters in science education from Boston



University. His first teaching stint was as a permanent substitute in Lowell, but once he landed a job teaching biology at CHS in 1957, there was no turning back. He went on to become the school's first science department head, first cross country coach, first athletic director. Do you see a recurring theme here?

Number 1. Some might call Simonian's exploits at his new home, Chelmsford High, immersion therapy. Others would say it's been an intense drive to make it the best it can be. That's what he did until he retired as principal in 1988. And that's what he continues to do, as leader of this association that gives so much back to its students year after year at scholarship awards nights, and the like. His efforts, and those of many others, have left the scholarship fund endowed at more than \$1 million. Simonian, CHS class of '74 grad Billy Keohane, and class of '78 grad Bill Logan started the Chelmsford High School Alumni Association in 1988, inducting its

first Hall of Fame in 1991, which honors CHS students, teachers and administrators for success in all walks of life, from academia to athletics to humanitarianism.

His next big thing? Endowing the association, staffing it, and building a permanent home where social events and awards presentations could be made. An artist's rendering of what Chelmsford High Alumni Hall might one day look like, one day soon, Simonian and the rest of us hope, graces the back of most issues of this alumni magazine. The capital fundraising committee conservatively estimates \$5 million is needed for this effort. In this economy, which some say may be brightening, that's no drop in the bucket. But perhaps there are some alums out there – some who have done quite well for themselves – who can drop some cash in the bucket. Your alma mater probably served you quite well. It would be an incredible way to give back. And it would make George Simonian proud. Of course, showing his Lion's pride is old hat for him. Yet, like the man himself, it would seem, it never gets old.

Back in the mid- to late 70s as I wound my way through CHS, I never fully appreciated the job he was doing. I thought he gravitated toward a particular group of kids and only got to know them. Boy was I wrong. Pull a name from a hat during his years at CHS, be it a jock, a brain, or any other category, and he can rattle off the year of graduation, hobbies, even the occasional girlfriend or boyfriend. In short, he was invested and remains invested in Chelmsford High School. I wish I knew then what I know now. Chelmsford High has known no greater friend. Thanks, Mr. Simonian, for being there for me then, and now. 🐾

ACTIVE TEACHERS, FACULTY NOW ELIGIBLE FOR HALL OF FAME

The Chelmsford High School Alumni Association's Board of Directors voted unanimously Oct. 5 to alter the criteria for nominations to the group's Hall of Fame to include active teachers or administrators who have served a minimum of 20 years at Chelmsford High School. Previously, such candidates could not be considered for nomination until at least five years after their association with CHS had ended.

The move to include active faculty was first proposed by board member Kris Pisarik last spring as a way to boost teacher morale while also broadening the pool of deserving candidates and the potential membership of the organization. The motion to adopt the new policy was made by Robert Pariseau, vice president of the association, who is also a member of the Hall of Fame nominating committee. ❖

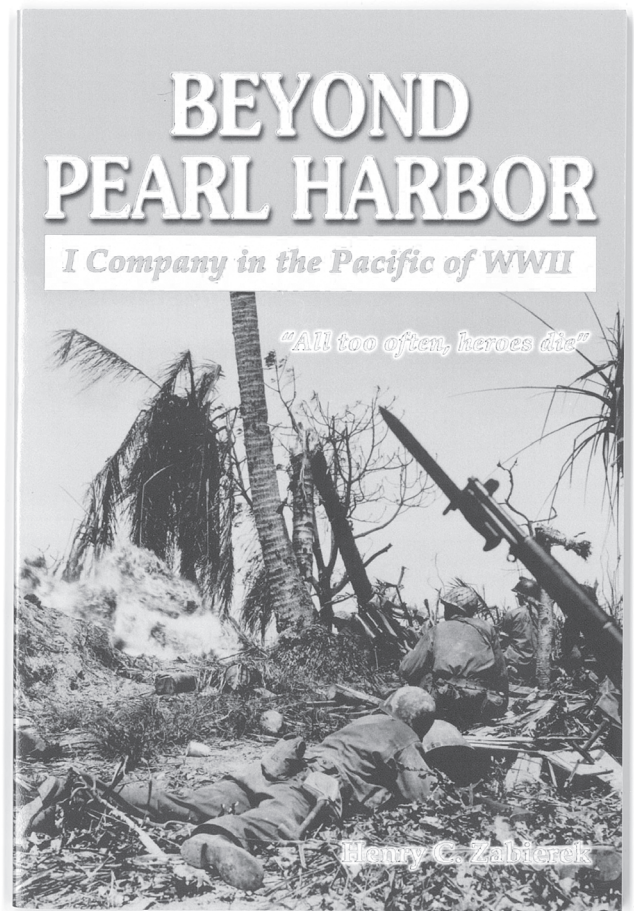
FORMER LION'S PRIDE EDITOR'S BOOK BEYOND PEARL HARBOR IS PUBLISHED POSTHUMOUSLY

Henry (Hank) Zabierek died in 2008 at the age of 84. His ashes are entombed at Arlington National Cemetery in Washington D.C. For several years before his death he volunteered as Editor of the Lion's Pride, Chelmsford High School's Alumni newsletter. However, on Hank's computer was left a book he wrote, which his sons downloaded. Last month, White Mane, a Pennsylvania publishing company, published it. – Roy Zabierek, Class of 1953

BEYOND PEARL HARBOR is the story of I Company in the Pacific and chronicles the actual incidents and battles illustrating the nature of the Pacific War as the 32nd Division battled through the jungles of New Guinea, to the mountains and valleys of the Philippines and the eventual occupation of Japan itself. Hank was one of those men in I Company who fought disease and suffered under intense heat as they faced an unpredictable enemy that was more than willing to die for their emperor. This is a story of men thrown together who differed in interests, education and outlook – ordinary men who often did extraordinary things.

BEYOND PEARL HARBOR sells for \$9.95 on Amazon. However, the Zabierek family will provide the Chelmsford High Alumni Association books at no cost to be sold to CHS Alumni and friends for \$5.00 with all proceeds from the sales going to the Henry C. Zabierek Scholarship Fund for future scholarships to CHS graduates. Books are available by calling the Alumni Association office, from any Zabierek family member and from George Simonian, Executive Director of the Association.

Hank, a 1942 graduate of CHS, received his Bachelor's degree from the University of Rhode Island, a Master's Degree from Boston University and a Doctorate Degree from Carnegie Mellon University. For 46 years he served as a teacher and administrator in several Massachusetts and New Hampshire school systems. He was voted into the CHS Alumni Hall of Fame. Interestingly, he was basketball coach at Punahou Academy in Hawaii, brought there by Jim Doole,



also a CHS graduate. Punahou was the high school of President Obama when he lived with his grandparents in Hawaii.

Hank co-authored, with other history educators, the original text of "Facing History and Ourselves," a curriculum on the Holocaust that is now used annually for over half a million students throughout the world. The program was on a national television show hosted by Bill Moyers and featured on the Today show as well.

When Hank passed in 2008, at the age of 84, he left behind only two living members of I company. Hank also left behind, beside his 4 sons and 8 grandchildren, two other CHS graduates, his sister, Stephanie Allen (Class of 1937), who lives locally on Hornbeam Hill Road, and brother Roy (Class of 1953), who resides in Fort Myers, Florida, but summers next door, in Billerica. 🌺

CHS is off to a successful start for the 2010-2011 school year. Both staff and students have hit the ground running and are now settled into the schedule. I am looking forward to another great year with excellent student performance in all areas of academics, athletics and extra-curricular activities. Our facility continues to undergo improvements as well, and looks better with every project. We will certainly miss the dedicated staff members who have retired this past June. I am confident that our students and staff will continue to accomplish amazing goals again this year.

We have just received the results of our 2010 MCAS Testing. I am proud to inform you that every CHS student that took the 10th grade Math and English tests passed! This is the first time this has happened in the history of our MCAS performance testing. The staff and students should be very proud of this accomplishment. Our curriculum and standards at CHS remain among the best in the state.

This fall, some of our Class of 2010 students will be attending Harvard, MIT, and Boston College, just to name a few of the impressive institutions that our students were accepted to. We have recently received news of the 2010 Advanced Placement Scholars. There were forty-nine students who were honored as AP Scholars; thirteen of those were designated as Scholars with Honor and fifteen were designated as Scholars with Distinction.



CHS underwent more facility improvements this year that have made a huge difference in our building. Over the summer both cafeterias were renovated, literally from ceiling to the floor! In addition to new ceilings and floors, the cafes received a new coat of paint and additional light fixtures were installed. Since students and faculty often meet in the cafes this was certainly a most welcome renovation. The other area of improvement was in our Foreign Language Lab. This lab is now a state-of-the-art learning center that will be available to two classrooms of 28 students every class period. This facility allows 21st century learning opportunities. We are thrilled to see our 36 year old building undergo these changes, because they make such an impact on student learning and attitude.

CHS certainly will never replace the dedicated staff members who retired this past year. We lost members of our faculty who had over 30 years each of commitment to our students and academic program. It is impossible to replace those years of commitment

and dedication. However, I am very excited that we were able to replace those staff members with the "best of the best" candidates that applied for the openings. One of our positions had over 500 applicants! It was a very busy summer interviewing and selecting the new members of our faculty. I want to congratulate and welcome our new members to CHS.

Our community members have continued to support CHS with their involvement. Jack Fletcher (CHS Class of 1968, former teacher, coach and current Athletic Director) was honored this past June after our old weight room was renovated and dedicated as the Jack Fletcher Weight Room. Angelo J. Taranto (former science teacher, department head, CHS Dean, and current School Committee member) was also honored after a new concession stand at the Carl A. Olsson Track at McCarthy Middle School. The track was dedicated as the Angelo J. Taranto Field House. Both of these projects were supported and developed by community members and CHS Alumni. These efforts by our alumni and community members demonstrate the real spirit of Chelmsford.

I look forward to a great year in academics, the arts, athletics, and extra-curricular activities. CHS never settles for mediocrity. We are Chelmsford and no one could be prouder. I hope that all the alumni members continue to support CHS with pride. Go Lions!

CHS ALUMNUS PROFILE

JACK FLETCHER

When Jack Fletcher arrived at CHS in 1974, he began a journey that would culminate in a long legacy of selfless devotion and dedication to students, a life long commitment to making a difference in the lives of those students and in the culture of CHS. Over the years he has touched the lives of countless young people as well as the lives of coaches, teachers and administrators with whom he has worked. According to Al Thomas, who retired as principal in 2009, "Jack Fletcher has had a more positive impact on life at CHS than almost anyone else. He was an effective teacher, a top coach and an outstanding athletic director." And George Simonian responds without hesitation, "Jack is the ultimate team player in the classroom, on the field and as athletic director. If you are selecting a team, you want him on your team."

Jack's journey began as a student and athlete at CHS. He graduated from Chelmsford High School in 1968 after attending Westlands Elementary School through grade six and the McFarlin Junior High School. He remembers playing Little League Baseball and recalls with a smile his first football experience "being the 75 pound tackle in Harry Ayotte's league." When asked about his fondest high school memory, Jack quickly responds, "I was the quarterback on the football team, dating a cheerleader, Jane Kelly ('69), who was the sister to my best friend. What could have been better?" He goes on to reminisce about playing hockey, when it was a new CHS sport, for Coach Melchiono and playing baseball for Coach Dave McPhelim.

He went on to graduate from Norwich University in 1972 where he earned a BA in Physical Education and Health and a minor in math. Jack attributes his decision to pursue a career in education to Gerry Schrock, his physical education teacher and to Dick McCaffrey, his math teacher. Jack Conrad and Angie Taranto were influential in his decision to become a PE teacher. He also recalls George Simonian's words of wisdom that encouraged him to go into math.

Before coming to CHS, Jack taught at Bishop Guertin for two years where his love of teaching began. At that time

he remembers living next door to CHS math teacher, Barry Ware, who became his unofficial mentor and would later become his colleague. When preparing lessons, Fletcher would run next door to discuss them with Barry.

Jack's coaching career at CHS began in 1972 during his first year of teaching at BG.

"I had just turned 22, when Tom Eck, my high school football coach asked me to coach hockey at CHS. I began to coach JV Hockey and also became the assistant varsity coach. It's hard to believe that at that time we played on the outdoor tennis courts at U Mass Lowell. We have come a million miles," Jack reflects, "from ice hockey never making the tournament to becoming one of the top teams in the state."

In 1974 Fletcher began his teaching career at CHS. "I had the best job going teaching half PE and half math." Many of Jack's colleagues have applauded his talent for reaching those students who found math particularly challenging. Jack recalls that by 1982 with Proposition 2½, while many were losing their jobs, he was lucky to begin teaching a full math schedule. When another cut came along in 1988, he went back to teaching health and in that year became the athletic director.

In addition to coaching hockey, Jack began coaching football in 1976, with Tom Caito. "Coach Caito taught me how to work with kids and that changed everything. I loved working for him; I wanted to win just to see how tickled he got." Fletcher goes on to say that Coach Dunn, an assistant coach, taught him how to maintain

perspective and balance. "I developed a passion for coaching; I prepared lesson plans for practice just as I did for teaching a class. I love helping kids move beyond their comfort zone and seeing kids achieve on levels they never dreamed they could." Jack was hooked on working with and coaching young adults.

"In coaching for Jack for the past 20 years," field hockey and lacrosse coach Maura Devaney shares, "I have had the privilege of working beside and learning from this man who at the end of each conversation states that 'if it's good for kids, let's go for it.'" According to Devaney, that is why in addition to scheduling anywhere from 18-20 standard league and non-league varsity and JV schedules per season, Jack makes it a priority to schedule anywhere from 18-25 contests for freshman and JVB teams. Devaney adds, "Actually, while most districts have downsized or even eliminated freshman and JVB programs because of budgeting and scheduling problems, Jack packs the schedule with game time opportunities...even in venues such as the stadium" because as he often says, "Every kid should have [these] opportunities!"

Al Thomas acknowledges that, "Jack Fletcher has helped to build the CHS athletic program into one of the best in the state. He is proud of the program, and he should be." Jack delights in the fact that "CHS has a huge number of kids participating in a huge number of sports programs and a huge number of enthusiastically supportive spectators." Devaney adds, "Jack exudes passion and pride for the Chelmsford Lions with every word and action! His famous last line to his coaches as they leave for a contest, 'Remember, we are with you win or win!' is understood as not necessarily coming back with a victory by score, but coming back with something that happened that was 'good for kids!'" Nancy Williams, a retired colleague, praises Fletcher for his efforts to champion girls' sports, especially early on when many other districts were reluctant to give female athletes the opportunities that they deserved and were entitled to.

When asked why Chelmsford for all these years, Jack quickly replies, "I never felt like I was going to work, not one day in 38 years. I have the best job of any administrator working with coaches and kids. CHS has been my second home, and I have tried to make it the kids' home away from home, a safe place to be. I have always loved working with kids to help them rebound from difficult situations." Fletcher goes on to say that not a day went by that he didn't learn something from the students with whom he worked.

When it comes to helping students, Jack always works hard to find a way. His heart is huge. "He finds a 'job' a

"place" for every person in need," Devaney shares. "From kids struggling with issues at home, to kids struggling with health issues to kids struggling to just fit in, Jack makes everyone feel as if they are the most important people in the world."

Jack found a way last spring when both girls' and boys' lacrosse teams were scheduled to play at Lincoln-Sudbury on the same day in June as their senior banquet. Realizing that the seniors would not arrive at their banquet until after 9:30, Jack worked out a plan that would allow the athletes to focus on their state tournament games and enjoy their banquet as well. He ordered two vans, one of which he personally drove to the game. The athletes had their dresses and suits awaiting them in the vans in which their coaches drove them to the Westin in Waltham. The seniors arrived at the banquet not much later than 7:00 to enjoy their celebration with the class of 2010, thanks to Jack.

"Jack's work ethic is second to none. He is the type of person who gets things done," remarks Baseball Coach Mike O'Keefe. "I have never seen another AD do as much with as little (budget) as Jack does." Coach Maura Devaney adds, "Jack gets out there, lining fields, moving stands, raking infields and, of course, on his famous 'quick dry days' soaking up the puddles in front of nets or at home plate. Jack is the rare administrator who rolls up his sleeves, steps in the mud and finds a way to let the games go on." Al Thomas recalls a night when the officials were going to cancel a soccer game because the soccer goal was bent in the middle. In the dark Jack, with the help of some other athletes, hooked up a trailer to his truck and got another goal from the top field, not an easy task. In the end, the game took place. And if on occasion there are no refs, while other districts may cancel the games, Jack answers the call in minutes and searches until he finds someone to referee or umpire the game.

Jack faced one of his greatest challenges during his first year as AD in 1989 with \$35,000 cut from the athletic bus budget and \$100,000 cut from the general athletic budget. Jack was instrumental in forming a fund raising committee and ultimately kept the program intact maintaining not only all sports but also all levels of sports by using gate receipts and by adopting registration and parking fees to help sustain athletics and activities. Jack also devised financial aid programs to help kids by setting up payment plans for families. "Jack always tried to provide financial support for athletes who couldn't afford to pay fees and to buy equipment," remarks Al Thomas

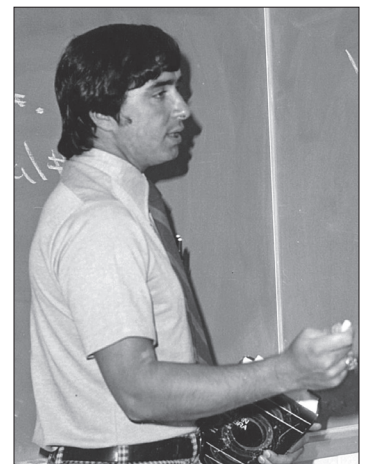
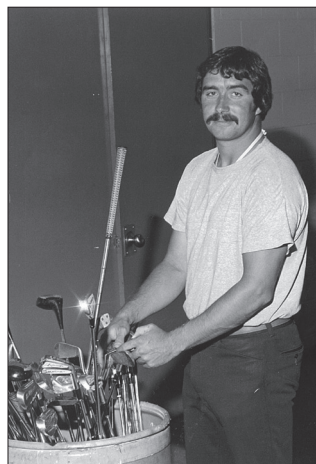
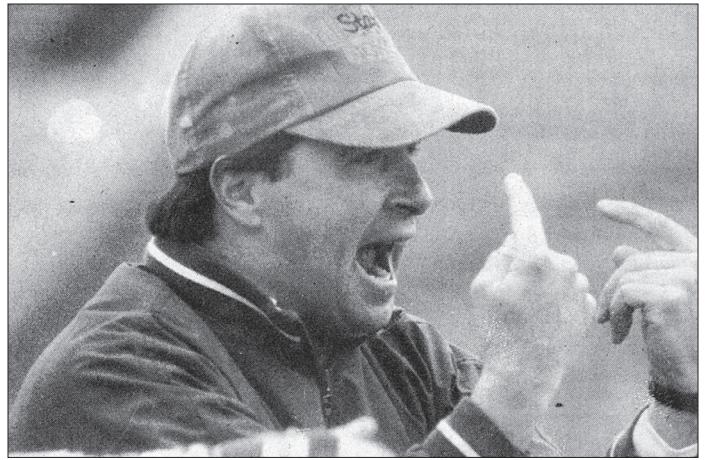

praising Jack as “an outstanding AD who has maintained a quality program while continually faced with budget cuts.” Jack didn’t stop there. That year two students had been accepted to Harvard. Jack contacted the director of admissions and asked if those students would have been accepted if they had had no extra curricular involvement. The answer simply put was that the possibility of their acceptance would have been greatly diminished. Jack presented his findings to the school committee.

When asked about the dedication of the new CHS weight room to him, Jack responds, “It was a humbling experience. Many other people who have allowed me to be who I am should be recognized before I am.” A typical response from this humble man, who, according to Al Thomas, “often deflects praise to coaches and players.”

When asked about his decision to retire in June, Jack says that he looks forward to spending more time with his family. Jack and his wife, Jane Kelly ('69) recently celebrated their 40th wedding anniversary, and in October, they traveled to Carlsbad, California to the wedding of their daughter, Katie ('98) who lives there. Their older daughter Kelly ('88) gave up her job at Fidelity to be home with her three children, eight-year-old Ben, six-year-old Julia and four-year-old Caroline. Jack's older son, Jason ('92) and his wife Tara Souleotis ('99) are the proud new parents of three-month-old Abby. Todd ('03) is a guidance counselor at a Waltham middle school and, following in his dad's footsteps, is the head girls' hockey coach at Westford Academy. Jack especially looks forward to spending more time with his grandchildren at his lake house in Winnepesaukee, riding jet skis, bicycling and skiing with them in the winter as well as attending their school and sports activities. Jack mentions proudly that Ben is playing hockey on the Squirt Team. “It’s fun watching them grow up. Jane and I are very fortunate.”

Mike O’Keefe describes Jack Fletcher as “one of the most selfless people I have ever had the pleasure of meeting. I’ve been fortunate to meet many tremendous educators with similar goals. A few are in the same category as Jack, but I’ve yet to meet someone who has helped more kids and coaches than he has. He is truly one of a kind. TWELFTH ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS NIGHT

An Evening of Giving Back

From their participation in the 24 Hour Relay, to raising money for the Shriners Hospital for Children, to walking for breast cancer, to collecting food for the food pantry and sending supplies and cards to soldiers in Iraq, CHS students have a history rich in giving back. That practice follows them long after graduation; it is from that tradition that the CHSAA Scholarship Program was born and continues to grow.

That spirit continued last May 19th, when 105 scholarships in the amount of \$47,475 were presented to deserving CHS graduates who walked across the stage in the Performing Arts Center. The evening began with the association's President Terry McSheehy ('64) welcoming the many recipients and their proud families to the CHSAA Twelfth Annual Scholarship Awards Night. This evening is made possible because "alumni give something back," McSheehy remarked with pride.

In her welcoming comments Principal Anne O'Sullivan O'Bryant ('71) commented on the fact that "Chelmsford's Alumni Association is so unique." And unique it is when one considers that as of the 2010 awards night, the CHSAA has presented 789 scholarships totaling \$404,875 to deserving CHS graduates and that its endowment fund remains slightly above one million dollars.

Executive Director George Simonian shared information regarding the history of the CHSAA scholarship program which was established in 1990 when George Parkhurst ('32) donated \$1000 to begin the endowment concept for the association resulting in the first award being presented in the spring of 1991. Later Parkhurst proposed the idea of special scholarships "developed by donations from an individual or an organization in the name of the individual or organization being recognized by the particular scholarship." Simonian went on to say, "Giving back is what it's all about."

K.C. Cameron ('39) established one of those scholarships in 2002. "This is the ninth year that I have come here to present this award," KC Cameron shared. She established the Frances Marie Cameron Scholarship in memory of her sister, Marie, who became ill and passed away while attending the Westlands School. The award was presented to Jillian Bungard who plans to enter the nursing profession. "It is just so great to be here and be a part of all this," KC added. These scholarships help graduates succeed while also keeping alive the memories of the loved ones for whom they are named. Any one may establish a scholarship in recognition of a person, organization or group by donating a minimum of \$5,000 that must be submitted to the CHSAA Endowment Fund by September 1st of the school year in which the award will be given.

Many of the 81 students who were recipients of the alumni scholarships were also students who are committed to service and "giving back."

Jennilee Mark plans to use her Class of 1998 Scholarship to help with her expenses to Castleton State in Vermont. The scholarship was awarded to the high-ranking senior for her outstanding service to CHS. Jennilee's service goes beyond CHS to Red Lake, Minnesota where she worked on the construction of a children's day care center.

Matt Linehan considered his three scholarships "a nice wrap-up to be rewarded for his school and community work." Matt was the recipient of the Leo J. Auger Scholarship, the Murray B. Hicks Scholarship for his contributions to CHS during his senior year, and the Peter R. Markham Scholarship awarded to a student who will attend BC, Markham's alma mater.

"I put a lot of work into it for three years" and managed a lot of "last minute scrambles," Shamiram Barooshian said proudly after receiving the newly established CHS 24 Hour Relay Challenge Scholarship for her outstanding commitment to the success of the community wide fun raising event. Shamiram's belief in giving back has also taken her to Maine to build homes with her church mission group.

Ryan Donaher, a Boston University School of Education graduate student, accepted the Bains Family Scholarship awarded to a deserving graduate who is enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate program “for his commitment to community service and to effecting positive social change.” Ryan felt “honored to receive the scholarship and delighted that the CHSAA recognizes graduates who work hard at the college level.”

Parents and students thanked the Awards Night Committee whose cooperative efforts made the evening a great success. The committee included: Nancy Delmore Hughes ('65), Lynne Marshall McSheehy ('64), Bob Pariseau ('64), Carol Pilat ('66), Cynthia Judge Sandholm ('69), Ann Swierzbins and Nancy Williams, all giving tirelessly of their time. Back stage Mark Ouellette and Elisa Simonian Ouellette ('87) took pictures of each of the recipients.

Since the May awards night, the spirit of giving back continues, thanks to graduates and their families, as new scholarships have been added to the already impressive list.

And the words of George Simonian continue to resonate in our minds and hearts: “We make a living with what we get, but we make a life by what we give.” 🌸

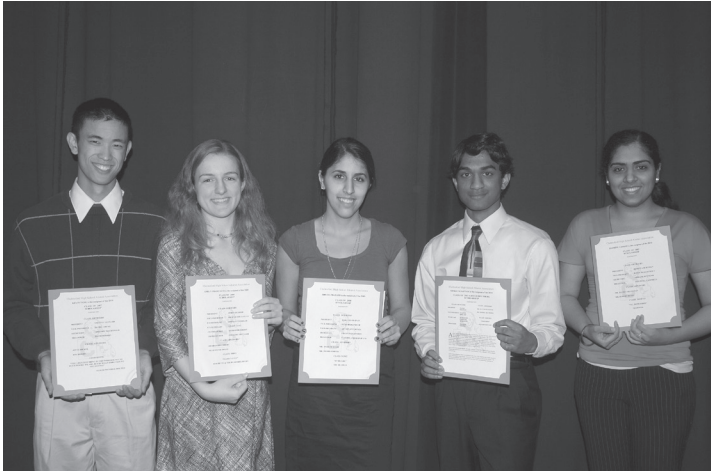

SPARSE BUT SPIRITED CROWD AT ANNUAL MEETING

The Chelmsford High School Alumni Association held its annual meeting on Wednesday, Sept. 22, in the high school cafeteria. Only 10 association members attended, most of whom were members of the Board of Directors.

Nancy Hughes of the nominating committee reported that the following directors were re-elected to three-year terms: Jessica Del Llano, Robert Pariseau, Kris Pisarik, John Sousa, and George Simonian.

Elisa Ouellette handed out several pages of financial records and briefly reviewed her treasurer's report, including highlights that the association's scholarship endowment fund stood at \$1,059,761.01 as of Aug. 31, 2010; the reunion fund contained \$50,091.13; and the Hall of Fame operating budget was at \$96,004.33.

In a wide-ranging report, and the last one of the evening, Executive Director George Simonian reported on a myriad of topics:

He tipped his cap to the dedicated volunteer staff of the Lion's Pride, now in its 20th year of publication. Simonian also was enthusiastic that the endowment fund and scholarship program continues to thrive, with two additional scholarships added the week of the annual meeting. "This is a success story. I tell people and they don't believe it," he said. He noted that at the spring awards night some \$47,500 was given out in 105 scholarships. Since 1993, \$418,000 has been given in 788 scholarships.

He also noted that membership stood at 1,750 members, which he hopes will increase.

Simonian also expressed hope that the capital fund-raising campaign could begin in earnest soon toward endowing the association, a staff and erecting a structure near the high school.

He also announced the next Hall of Fame induction dinner would be held on March 26 at the Radisson in Nashua, N.H. 🍷
