# THE LIONS SHARE

For nearly 3 decades, CHS alums have been giving back

Giving back. It's what we do. It's what the Chelmsford High School Alumni Association has been doing for nearly three decades.

It all started back in 1990 when CHS alums Bill Keohane, Class of '74, Bill Logan, Class of '78 and Executive Director and retired CHS Principal George Simonian thought it would be nice to have a group where alumni could still connect despite everything going on in their posthigh school lives.

A steering committee was formed, then a charter – with a heavy assist from alum Dennis McHugh, a local attorney – and the organization began to take root. A newsletter was formed and eventually blossomed into this magazine, but what else should the organization do, its founders wondered.

Simonian's neighbor, Town Historian George Parkhurst, was out cutting his lawn on Overlook Drive and after a brief chat about the fledgling group developed what Simonian called a "gung-ho" attitude and he donated \$1,000 in 1990 to begin the endowment concept for the CHSAA. Ultimately, it was Parkhurst's \$5,000 check in 1993 that began the dedicated scholarships for CHSAA Scholarship Endowment Fund and the first scholarship was named for him.

Today, there are more than 100 dedicated scholarships. Anyone can start such a scholarship with a \$5,000 donation that remains permanently endowed, as the awards are only taken from the interest earned on the account. To date, 1845 scholarships have been awarded totaling more than \$825,000.

#### But why?

"We like to see CHS kids, whoever they are, be successful in whatever they're doing," Simonian said during a recent interview.

CHSAA President Terry McSheehy noted that giving back is the core of the organization's mission.

"One of the primary principles of the Chelmsford High School Alumni Association is the belief in giving back," he said. "Giving back not only to alumni but also to students at CHS. It is the responsibility of everyone, to do what they can to help those who have gone before them and also those who are coming up behind them.

"Without this spirit of giving back many alumni and CHS students would not have had the

opportunities they needed to succeed in their lives and careers," McSheehy continued. "We have many examples of how the members of the CHSAA have given back. To name just a couple, the most important and longest existing one is the Scholarship Endowment Fund, which has given out over \$800,000 to the alumni and students of CHS."

The dedicated scholarships all have a back story. One of the more interesting ones, according to Simonian, is the Fanita Gray Scholarship, which was established in 2001. Simonian received a letter from alum Eva Tully, at that time living in Alexandria, Virginia, who wanted to join the association. So he explained the process, the magazine, and what the CHSAA's mission was: giving back. After about a year, she wrote a check for \$5,000 to name a scholarship for Gray, her foster aunt who put her through college.

But year after year, she said, "I've got to do better," he related.

In the end, before she died, she had donated \$140,000 to the endowment fund.

Another moving anecdote, Simonian said, is when grad Mark Wholey began a scholarship in memory of his high school teammate, Jeffrey Heroux, a standout defensive tackle on the football team who became ill and died some years later. The golf tournament he organized to raise money for the award in memory of his friend raised over \$120,000 over a 10-year span.

Additionally, every graduating class leaves behind money from the class dues for a scholarship to commemorate their time at CHS.

"The second and newest endeavor is the SHARE Program whose purpose is to facilitate the mentoring of the CHS students by CHSAA members," McSheehy said.

CHS Hall of Fame and retired science teacher Dennis Hunt is spearheading this effort.

"This program is in its infancy but has great promise to be a real asset to the students and alumni of CHS," McSheehy said.

Simonian called Program Share an invaluable resource for current students and graduates as it establishes a mentorship pipeline for them.

Ultimately, the CHSAA wants to raise enough money to permanently endow the organization (eliminating dues), hire an executive director and construct a building on campus where reunions could be held, Program Share meetings and other important events could be held.

The organization is always looking for more members and volunteers who run everything from the scholarship awards nights, to Hall of Fame inductions, and producing this magazine and more. Encourage your graduating sons, daughters, grandkids, nephews and nieces and friends to join and get involved when they can.  $\diamond$

# **PRINCIPAL'S** Report , By Stephen Murray Class of 1988

Life at Chelmsford High School is going great. We are off to a good start. Many years ago, we had vibrant and enriching World Language Cultural Exchange opportunities for our students. Their programs took our kids to France and Spain. For many reasons, this program was discontinued.

Due the tenacity and hard work from Ms. Marin Chagnon and Ms. Veronica Gadbois, we are taking steps to give our students similar experiences as those students who benefited from past exchange programs. Forty-eight students travelled to Québec in March 2018 to spend 4 days enhancing their French speaking skills! In 2019, once again, the French students will travel to Québec in May. This time, they will have the chance to meet with their Québecois pen-pals at a school on the outskirts of the city. Over February vacation, 20 French students will spend 10 days in France. They will visit sites in Paris as well as travel to Normandy and Mont St. Michel. Ms. Gauthier, Ms. Loiselle, Ms. Pratt-Herman, Mr. Mulrooney, Ms. Taha and Ms. Sanchez are planning a similar trip to Spain for our Spanish students. Living in a global society, these experiences are invaluable.

Lockheed Martin Missile and Fire Control selected our school to receive a charitable donation for our STEM educational pursuits. We are excited to announce that their generous donation of \$2500 will help support our Robotics program. Ms. Kiernan-Bell is one of our programming teachers. Over the past 10 years, Ms. Kiernan-Bell brought in almost \$100,000 in donations and grants. She is one of the reasons



why our programming and robotics classes are going strong. Lockheed Martin's generous donations and the talented teachers in our math and science departments are the reasons why these programs exist.

I am excited to announce that 12 of our students were commended by The National Merit Scholarship program. We also had one semifinalist. Every October, about 1.6 million juniors across the country take the PSAT. Those who score in the top 1% achieve the distinction of National Merit Semifinalist. Most of these students move on to become National Merit Finalists, with some winning scholarship money for college. Being commended is quite an honor. Being named as a semifinalist is amazing.

Bill Silver (District Director for Technology) and Dr. Sweeney (Coordinator for Technology and Business) are starting a 1:1 computer initiative. Freshmen teachers will be piloting this program next year in which all freshmen students will receive a laptop. They are designing professional development opportunities for freshmen teachers in order to get ready for the 1:1 roll out next year. Our students will definitely benefit from this endeavor.



# ATHLETIC DIRECTOR'S Report , By Dan Hart Class of 1999


Chelmsford High School Athletics is coming off one of our more successful Spring Seasons in recent memory. This past spring we had two teams capture Division 1 North Championships:

### Make a Difference Gift your "IRA Rollover" to the CHSAA CHS Alumni aged 701/2 or Older

The Protecting Americans from Tax Hikes (PATH) Act of 2015, which was passed by Congress and signed into law by the president on December 18, 2015, made permanent what is popularly known as the IRA charitable rollover.

#### Here are the requirements and restrictions for making an IRA charitable rollover gift:

- The donor must be 70½ or older.
- The gift must be made directly from the IRA to an eligible charitable organization.
- Gifts to all charities combined cannot exceed a total of \$100,000 per taxpayer for the year.
- The gifts must be outright, and no material benefits can be received in return for the gifts. Thus a transfer for a gift annuity, charitable remainder trust, or pooled income fund is not permitted.
- Gifts cannot be made to a donor advised fund, supporting organization, or private foundation.
- The gift is not included in taxable income, and no charitable deduction is allowed.

#### The difference your gift will make:

- Endow the Association with a full-time Executive Director and erect Alumni Hall as the official community building for everything CHS.
- Provide you "naming rights" on rooms within Alumni Hall
- You pay no federal income taxes on your gift. Your gift generates neither taxable income nor tax deductions.

# THE TWENTIETH ANNUAL Some SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS NIGHT

As people poured into the Performing Arts Center for the Twentieth Annual Awards Night by the Chelmsford High School Alumni Association, the excitement in the air was palpable. Today, a resounding total of \$825,000 has been accorded to high achieving seniors in the last 20 years.

In accordance to the eloquent words spoken by CHSAA Executive Director George Simonian, the Chelmsford High School Alumni Association has "made a living with what we got and made a life with what they gave." This association has touched the lives of many by opening doors that only money could provide. These scholarships have given students the opportunity to broaden their horizons, by alleviating some of the stress that lack of money may cause. The Scholarship Committee requests every donor and CHS graduating class to grant at least \$5,000 to support the senior recipients.

The CHSAA supports all students regardless of background and need. They have done a commendable job matching students from all walks of life with appropriate scholarships. Students have received scholarships ranging from their excellence in academia, community service, and their moral standing to their laudatory performance in athletics, art and music. CHSAA President Terry McSheehy said his only regret is that "five scholarships didn't get presented because students didn't apply for them." He encourages every student to apply for the scholarships because they might surprise themselves by being the recipient of at least one. Simonian stated that he is glad that they have "managed to keep the event quick and moving along," but always aspires to give out more scholarships in the following year.

After interviewing several scholarship recipients, the common consensus has been that "any scholarship is better than no scholarship." Their pride, gratitude, and exhilaration shone through their beaming faces in the pictures they took to commemorate their night in the spotlight. These seniors are very grateful for the support that the CHSAA has given them and hope to do the same for prospective seniors in the years to come.

Jessica Hagg, who will be attending Rivier University in the fall to major in education and community leadership, said of her scholarship, When I received my award, I was both shocked and honored. It was nice learning about the family for whom my scholarship was named and I am proud to keep their memory alive."

Fanny Riand, who plans to study biology in college, said, "I am incredibly grateful to have received three scholarships from the CHSAA. Not only are they helping make my dreams possible, they are showing that they believe in my potential, and that truly means a lot."

Future WPI biomedical engineering major Lindsay Ambrosino said, "to know that I was chosen for the awards dedicated to such amazing people in the Chelmsford community meant so much to me, and will really help in paying for college." She also greatly appreciated the awards night as a whole, saying that "it was run very well and overall a great celebration of senior achievements and alumni giving back."

As the joyous night drew to a close, the anticipation and excitement previously felt by the students lingered among them. Every CHS senior in the crowd had been waiting for these moments for their entire school career. Before them, their plans for senior barbecue, prom, and graduation pushed them along their path to their future. Each student had persevered to get to these moments of pride, happiness, and relief. 
