
HAPPY FOURTH OF JULY! I say that with full confidence that you will receive this in plenty of time for the Fourth of July

As I write for the spring CHS Alumni Newsletter, I have so many wonderful events to share with you. CHS students are once again shining stars in so many ways with their successful academic and extracurricular achievements. I am continually amazed at the caliber of student that our school and community continue to foster year after year.

Town Meeting will be at the end of April, but early indications suggest that the funding is much better than anticipated over the winter months. I am cautiously optimistic that the budget will be a little better than had been anticipated. I am keeping my fingers crossed that we will not have to lose staff or have our students lose opportunities in the Foreign Language, Fine Arts and Practical Arts areas. These programs are critical for engaging our students to be committed members of our school. I hope that I never have to cut such valuable opportunities for our students.

Chelmsford High School recently hosted a weekend tour for our Alumni "Hall of Fame" members. It was a pleasure to have those members who graduated from the current CHS building see the changes made to the high school since they left, and to showcase the building to those who attended Chelmsford High School in a former high school building. Some of our CHS students gave up a Saturday afternoon to take our former graduates and guests on tour around the building. It was a great opportunity to bring both students and graduates together to see what CHS is all about today. I



want to thank George Simonian for organizing the afternoon along with Maura Devaney who currently teaches Health at CHS and is a CHS graduate from the Class of 1988. The afternoon tour of the high school along with the CHS alumni dinner that evening were both wonderful opportunities to visit with so many of our graduates and renew old friendships.

At the Alumni dinner I shared some of the events that were happening that week. In just one recent week, we had students recognized at Winter Sports Awards Night, our students and teachers hosted an Parent Orientation night for parents of the incoming freshmen Class of 2014, we crowned "Mr. CHS" 2010 at our annual DECA competition, our Theater Guild won Massachusetts State Finals in the Theatre Guild competition play, and our school participated in MTV's "Made" show auditions. Students recently raised money for Haiti during PLUS Blocks and "Listening Lunches". Other students are currently collecting dresses for the" Belle of the Ball"

(a local community prom dress collection project), while others are collecting "Coins for a Cure" to benefit Childrens' Hospital in Boston. There is no end to the opportunities that our students take advantage of in order to do for others and achieve at the highest level.

I recently received three unrelated e-mails about how special our students at CHS are. The first e-mail was from a teacher in another district who had observed our students at a DECA conference consisting of thousands of students. This teacher wrote to tell me how our CHS students were so respectful, supportive, and engaged at the conference. He stated that their behavior in the audience was outstanding and how they were positive role models for other students. The second e-mail mentioned how talented our students in the Theater Guild were and how truly impressed he was with their performances. The individual who wrote me was a professional actor. Finally, the last email concerned one of our athletes. Rebecca Wong, a senior, was competing in a ski race this winter. During her run she missed a gate, so she left before the award ceremony knowing that she was out of medal contention. Her missing the gate was not noticed by race officials. Unbeknownst to her, she was named as the medal winner for that race and was named as one of the top ten skiers in the state and reported as such in the local media. Rebecca contacted the MIAA (Massachusetts Interscholastic Athletic Association) organization to let them know that she had missed the gate during the race and that

she should be disqualified. She wanted the proper race contestant to receive this award. The MIAA contacted me to share what they felt was such an outstanding expression of sportsmanship. No one would have ever known about the missed gate, but Rebecca would never have wanted to accept any award she didn't deserve. These e-mails are typical examples of the type of students we have at CHS.

Our DECA students won many awards at the Boston conference. Some of these students will continue on to conferences in New Orleans and California. The DECA students also organized a most successful competition for "Mr. CHS". Nine seniors competed for the title. The students were evaluated by our staff member judges in the categories of dance, talent, and communication. All of the contestants spoke of how much CHS meant to them and how they appreciated all the opportunities they had to be successful. Kevin Tang, Class President, was named "Mr. CHS". His talent and enthusiasm truly makes him a great representative for "Mr. CHS". There is no doubt that he will be a future member of the Alumni "Hall of Fame".

I hope that all of our local alumni members save the dates of May 6, 7, 8, 2010 to see the musical production of "Hello Dolly". I am anxious to see our extremely talented students in this musical. This year the CHS Drama Guild made it to the State Finals for the first time in eight years. At this time, the Drama Guild is planning to attend their first ever New England Regionals competition in Maine. Check out the CHS homepage and click on the Theatre Guild link for time and ticket information. The Theater Guild is also in the process of raising money for a storage facility. They are selling personalized engraved bricks for a walkway. The bricks are \$100 each. It would be great to have every

graduating class memorialized as part of the brick walkway. See the web site for more information.

Our students are now participating in spring athletics and I am looking forward to another season of success and good sportsmanship. In May we have the 12th Annual Chelmsford 24-Hour Relay Challenge on May 22-23 to look forward to, and of course I am looking forward to a great senior week and a successful graduation. Senior week is always such a great celebration for our students and one that they will remember for a long time.

I can't tell you how proud I am of our students and their continued demonstration of strong character, ethics and personal bests. The Chelmsford High community, supported by parents and teachers, makes for a unique community of respect and commitment for the high school. These strong relationships encourage our graduates to come back and work at CHS, stay in the community to raise their children, and continue to support our schools. This is what makes the Chelmsford High School Alumni Association such a special organization.

As the flowers bloom and spring begins to scent the air, the CHS Fine and Performing Arts Department is welcoming exciting developments! Our students, parents, and faculty members have accomplished much over the past months, and I look forward to sharing their endeavors with you.

This month, Theater news reigns supreme, as for the first time in history, Chelmsford High School has won the Massachusetts High School Drama Guild Competition with their incredible performance of Almost, Maine! Congratulations are due to director Lauren Cochran and the excellent actors and stage crew involved in this production. The cast and crew then traveled to Falmouth, Maine to represent Massachusetts at the New England Drama Festival during the weekend of April 15-17th.We are also looking forward to this year's musical by Carl Rondina and Ms. Cochran, Hello, Dolly! More information about all of these productions can be found at the Theater Guild's new Website, www. chelmsfordtheater.com.

In art news, many of our CHS art students are currently participating in K-12 art exhibit at the DOE building in Malden, MA, which will run through the end of May. Chelmsford was specifically invited to share student art at this prestigious location, speaking to the excellence of our teacher and student work in the district. This exhibit, facilitated by CHS Art Teacher Terry Karangioze, is currently being featured in the Fine Arts Department's monthly Chelmsford Channel 22 TV show, "Spotlight on Fine Arts," which airs locally three times a week, as well as on the DOE website, www.mass. doe.edu. In addition to this and many

other worthwhile projects with which our art students are involved, including a K-12 exhibit at the Chelmsford Public Library and an all-town art show at the Drum Hill Starbucks in Chelmsford, our department has once again won several awards at the annual Boston Globe Scholastic Art & Writing Award Competition. Two students here at CHS, Katie Guay and Jillian Montouri, were awarded Honorable Mention prizes, and were presented with special awards at the March 23rd School Committee Meeting.

In music news, the CHS Band collaborated with the Chelmsford Community Band for an exciting performance at the Chelmsford Performing Arts Center on April 6th, and our Choral and Orchestral groups shared their music with an enthusiastic crowd at the PAC on April 7th for their annual concerts to welcome in the spring. At these concerts, the band, led by Director Matthew Sexauer, and the Orchestra, directed by Kristin Chartier, showcased their programs that will be performed at this year's MICCA music festival on April 10, where the groups will work with national adjudicators.

Our most recent alumni article discussed the Northeast District Music Festivals, in which select student musicians are chosen through an audition process to perform with students from many towns and cities in MA. Many of our CHS students were chosen to participate in this festival, and I applaud all of them, as well as their excellent directors. Of these students, those who received a score in the top 50% of their area were eligible to audition for the MMEA All-State Ensembles. This year, three

of our CHS students, Gwendolyn Straeffer (Chorus), Jarred Velazquez (Band), and Emily Luan (Orchestra) were selected to participate in the All-State festival, performed at Symphony Hall in Boston at the end of March. Congratulations to these students and their CHS directors!

We are fortunate to have such a supportive community for the Arts, and the faculty and I look forward to continuing our work with the CHS students through the spring.

CHS ALUMNUS PROFILE

MIKE O'KEEFE '87

A 1987 graduate of Chelmsford High School, Mike O'Keefe fondly reminisces about teachers who made a difference for him. "Mr. Pasquale was always in touch with what his students were interested in," effectively using conversations with them to lead into the lesson of the day. He "was never in a hurry" always making sure that his students understood the material. Other teachers who left a lasting impression on Mike include: Jack Lang, Barry Ware, and Bill Christman. While academics always came first, Mike played on both the baseball and basketball teams and will forever remember how exciting it was when Chelmsford won both the baseball and basketball championships in his senior year. From his baseball coach, Bill Schoenfeld, and his basketball coach, Tom Gallagher, Mike learned that keeping up with schoolwork came first and that commitment and goal setting were life skills.

Mike took those skills on to Assumption College where it wasn't until he had graduated that he decided to enroll in a teacher certification program there, which ultimately led him to a teaching position at North High School in Worcester from 1993 to 1997. During that time Mike was also busy coaching freshmen baseball at CHS. It was at the suggestion of Athletic Director, Jack Fletcher (CHS '68) that Mike interview for a teaching position at Chelmsford High School and was hired in 1997 to teach history, joining a long list of other CHS graduates who have come back to Chelmsford High School to teach. Back then, Mike taught across the hall from Jack and recalls that he was a mentor to him. "I have never met anyone who is so totally about kids; they are his passion."

Today the same could be said of O'Keefe who is "totally about kids" in the classroom and on the baseball field. If you were to call his classroom, you would probably hear a student cheerfully answer, "Mr. O'Keefe's wonderful world of learning," words that resonate exactly how students feel about this dynamic history teacher. Both in the classroom and on the field, Mike sets high expectations for his students and his athletes and guides them towards setting goals for themselves and working to achieve those goals. Mike comments, "I teach life skills that kids are going to

use like working hard, applying what you learn, being committed and dealing graciously with both success and adversity." Mike currently teaches world history to freshmen and sociology to juniors and seniors. "The world history is great because I've always enjoyed history. You can make such a difference in freshmen's high school



careers giving them the proper start. I also love teaching juniors and seniors," Mike remarks. He goes on to say, "When people ask me what I teach, I tell them that I teach students. The material, while very important, is a tool to reaching young adults."

In the classroom the upbeat, energetic and enthusiastic O'Keefe has the amazing ability to engage each of his students by fostering a sense of community in which students feel comfortable while being encouraged to step out of that comfort zone to grow as individuals. Mike always remembers to keep his finger on the pulse of these young people, providing them time to discuss their lives, as well as the current events that influence them daily. Embracing creativity and innovation, O'Keefe often presents a riddle, prompting students to think outside of the box to arrive at the answer, or he may have students place their shirts across a "moat" so that a visitor to the class can enter as he teaches a lesson on chivalry.

And what do O'Keefe's students say about their teacher? One student responds, "Mr. O'Keefe taught me that I can push my limits and not give up on things." Another says, "He brought the history curriculum alive and encouraged me to step out of my comfort zone." Still another replies,

"He taught me to no longer be shy; I now speak with confidence when I talk." Finally, "He showed me the importance of living life to the fullest and laughing at least ten times a day."

Outside of his own class, Mike may be found helping at a Best Buddies meeting, checking on a colleague who may have been ill, sharing a riddle with an English class or encouraging a student who may be struggling in a math class. Or you may find him enjoying an evening at home with his wife Mary Beth O'Brien (CHS '87), laughing and playing with five-year-old son Jimmy and two-year-old daughter Katie.

When asked what is the greatest challenge facing teachers today, O'Keefe replies, "Motivating kids who are part of our technology-driven society." He goes on to say that more responsibility is placed on teachers today than ever before. As for students, the biggest challenge for them is "that more is expected of them because of our fast-paced society."

And when asked what has kept him at CHS, Mike responds without hesitation, "Being an alum... I have developed a pride over time. I had such a great high school experience in Chelmsford. I now have the opportunity to give back to my community. I would not want to be anywhere else. It's not everyone who has the good fortune to be able to look forward to going to work every day. My job is challenging, fun, rewarding. I hope that I will feel that way for many years to come."

While Mike may reminisce about teachers who have made a difference for him, little does he realize how much of a difference he has made in the lives of so many young people as well as in the lives of his colleagues and fellow coaches. Mike is a true leader and role model, living his life setting an example for others to follow.

In the words of Mike's dean, Heather Galante, "Mr. O'Keefe is a gem. He is the rare type of teacher who balances delivery of content with development of character. While he values high grades from students, he places more emphasis on integrity and being a good human being. With decades to teach before his retirement, it is safe to say Mr. O'Keefe has already achieved legendary status in the eyes of his students and colleagues."

CLASS ACTS, ONE AND ALL

Sure, it poured cats and dogs outside at the 20th Annual Chelmsford High Alumni Association Hall of Fame induction. But inside, nothing could dampen the flame burning brightly for this latest parade of honorees from CHS at the Radisson Hotel in Nashua, N.H., on March 13.

The induction of nine new members brought the number to 180 honorees in all since the Hall of Fame was begun two decades ago, and this year's installment proved to be a group of class acts – both literally, and figuratively – with most having some or extensive experience as educators in one form or another. From retired CHS Principal, Dean and English teacher Stephen Meidell to Math Coordinator Donna Upton Foley, the 2010 troupe of Hall of Famers goes to the head of the class in more way than one.

In his welcoming remarks, CHS Alumni Association President Terry McSheehy noted that this year's inductees spanned from classes ranging from 1966 to 1982. He also thanked the administration, the Chelmsford Rotary Club and

the Chelmsford Boosters Club for its support of the organization and CHS and its students in particular. He proudly noted that this publication is sent to members three times a year and that the association has given out more than \$325,000 in annual scholarships to deserving grads and that its endowment fund is over the \$1 million mark. First-year CHS Principal Anne O'Bryant tipped her cap to association Executive Director George Simonian, Meidell and many other assembled CHS educators past and present when she said, "This is what's exciting about being part of CHS. These individuals for me were mentors."

"It's quite an honor," said Foley (Class of 1970), at a pre-ceremony reception, where inductees and special guests noshed on fruit, cheese and crackers and wine. "When you're a kid you never think it's going to happen, but I've been part of the Chelmsford schools for the past 48 years," she said, proudly adding that her mom, Dorothy Nystrom Upton, was CHS valedictorian in 1947.

Foley also noted the circle-of-life feel to her CHS experiences during her public remarks, noting that

history teacher Mike O'Keefe, one of her former students, has since coached her nephew at CHS. Foley, a Tyngsboro resident, has coached youth soccer in her town and served on numerous educational committees. The former CHS Pep Club member also shared her comic side by wishing everyone a happy "pie day," as the following day was 3/14 (3.14), unable to resist the urge to include a little math in her presentation.

Another honoree, Dr. Stuart Weisfeldt, 82, though not an educator, per se, was feted as this year's recipient of the Lucy Simonian Golden Lion Award for his years of coaching everything from softball to swimming, and for his service to a host of committees at CHS. At the same pre-ceremony reception, he said, "it was very exciting to be involved with CHS." Weisfeldt, an obstetrician by profession, was on former CHS Principal Simonian's Parent Advisory Council when it gave birth to the idea of the Post-Prom all-night breakfast designed to keep CHS students safe in the often dangerous hours following the last dance.

One of my classmates from the Class of 1977, Sean McAdam, also a fellow journalist, was inducted for his contributions to sports writing and commentary. The former longtime sportswriter for the Providence Journal these days is a Littleton resident and reporter/commentator for the Comcast Sports Network.

"It's a tremendous honor," he told me before his induction. "My family has spent so much time in Chelmsford. It seems there's always been some connection to the school." In what was perhaps the most emotional induction speech of the night, McAdam said that if "anyone belonged in the CHS Hall of Fame," it was his mother, Dolores, who worked in the superintendent's office for many years and became a "real fixture" in the schools. Wiping moist eyes, he also said his late father, Robert, would be "looking down with pride tonight."

On a lighter note, McAdam wanted to know, "Why the hell do I look so old, and why does George Simonian look exactly the same way he did 33 years ago?"

McAdam thanked association Vice President Robert Pariseau for nominating him and also acknowledged three other Hall of Famers and noted sportswriters: Chaz Scoggins, Karen Guregian and Gerry Callahan who, like himself, make CHS a "cradle of sportswriters," if you will." He also thanked his teachers who "taught me how to think and how to think for myself."

Bruce Costa, an inductee from the Class of '75, earned his Hall of Fame wings for becoming an accomplished Navy helicopter test pilot and a Ph.D. in philosophy in business administration. The former Science Club member recounted his graduation night: June 7, 1975, when Celtics legend Satch Sanders was the main speaker. But what resonated with him even more than Sanders' "great" speech, was something George Ripsom, at the time a School Committee member, said: " I challenge you to fail." No one had said that to him before. "It stuck with me." Auto-rotation and safely landing helicopters gives one "good opportunity to fail every day." But

Costa noted the strength of such challenges allows one to grow and "go out and make the best (of life) that you can."

Michael "Doc" Economakos, longtime athletic trainer at CHS, was credited by Simonian with starting the student training program in the Merrimack Valley Conference. The program became a springboard for many of them to pursue careers in the health professions. He called CHS his "second home." He was effusive in his praise of Simonian and longtime Athletic Director Jack Fletcher, who always seems to find a way to finance things like the trainer's room. He also thanked him for his "friendship" and the "comic relief" he provided on a regular basis. He also thanked his wife, Patricia, saying, "you're beautiful, you're intelligent and you're my sunshine."

Kathy Zemaitis Lamarre, Class of 1974, was inducted for her athletic prowess at CHS, her teaching and coaching at Westford Academy and her perseverance. While teaching freshmen during a Project Adventure session, she fell from a height of 25 feet and shattered both legs. Many operations and therapy sessions later, she not only got back on her feet but went on for her master's degree in special education, which she now teaches at Nashoba Valley Technical High School. She called her induction "quite an honor."

Margaret Marshall, Class of 1972, daughter of well-known community activists, the late Ed and Liz Marshall, was honored for a broad spectrum of work, including her volunteerism with the Chernobyl Children's Project, serving as minister of music at at All Saints Episco-

pal Church and as Pelham, N.H.'s first library director. "Mom said democracy is not a spectator sport." She thanked two women whom she called the "best role models," former CHS librarian Betsy Bohl and Patricia Apostolakos Mahoney, her former English teacher. And in reference to the many agencies she's volunteered for, Marshall said, "It's better to give than receive. I will continue to look for meaningful volunteer opportunities."

Wendy Marshall Fenner, Class of 1985, was a little late to the party, and with good reason. As head boys track coach at Doherty High School in Worcester, Marshall Fenner was coaching student Angelito Destin at the high school national championships at the Reggie Lewis Center in Roxbury. He finished 12th in the nation in the high jump at 6-feet, 4.25 inches. She knows a thing or two about records, having set the CHS record in the 50-yard, 300-yard and 220yard dashes, to name a few. The indoor and outdoor track star was also a New England champion. She thanked longtime track coach Jack Lang, who attended her induction ceremony, and Economakos, for putting up with her non-stop talking. "When I refer to him (even today) as Mr. Lang, he said, 'call me Jack. You're making me feel old.' ... If the spikes fit," she joked. She also paid tribute to her brothers, who "came to most of my meets."

Steve Meidell thanked and named far too many people to include in this space, but among them were his many former students and colleagues. "I grew in my role as principal" from watching George Simonian, he said. "And I left CHS knowing it was in good hands,"

lauding his successor Al Thomas. "Deans (Bernie) Battle, (Jeff) Doherty, and Thomas were not only gifted teachers. They were the brothers I never had."

To his four kids, all of whom graduated from CHS, he said, "I'm so proud to be your father," and he called his wife Fran, an educator in the Lowell schools, "the wind beneath my wings. CHS has been a major part of my life, and you were all there for me."

Richard Siebert, Class of 1966, has been a busy boy since high school, becoming a Massachusetts State Police trooper, winning its top award, "The Bulldog" in 1981 for charity work on behalf of Children's Hospital, becoming a church deacon, not to mention serving a four-year stint in the Navy. In his speech, Siebert acknowledged that he "wasn't the best student," and sometimes "needed a lot of nudging. I was what I was." He credits his class: the "66ers," for their longstanding friendship. When in 2006 he battled laryngeal cancer, "they were there for me." "Life is a journey, and I've had one hell of a ride."

Getting back into his state trooper mode, Siebert concluded by saying, "They say a friend is someone who will bail you out of jail. A true friend is someone who will fight in a jail cell with you and say, 'wow, that was fun," he said, prompting the room to erupt in laughter.

Hello again. I hope everyone is as anxious as I am about this winter being over and looking forward to warmer weather coming our way.




